P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association

The board of examiners of the P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association will meet for the purpose of examining candidates offering for registration on Jan. 28th 1914.

Every candidate for examination shall satisfy the council that he has served as assistant in a drug store for not less than four years and at least two of these years has been employed in the dispensing of prescriptions.

Candidate must give notice to the Secretary Registrar in writing, of their intention to present themselves for examination at least fifteen days before the date fixed for the examination.

Such notice must be accompanied by examination fee of \$5.00 and by certificate to the satisfaction of the Council that the candidate possesses the qualifications above described.

Any person entering his name and not presenting himself at the time and place fixed for the examinations shall forfeit his fee to the Association.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL CONVENTION OVER

VEDRINES PLANS SOME LONG FLIGHTS.

CAIRO, Jan. 2.—Jules Vedrines, who has just completed a flight from Paris to Cairo, plans to leave Cairo in a fortnight and to fly to Australia via Jaffa, Aleppo, Bagdad, Calcutta, Singapore, and Java and other islands, and then 200 miles across the sea—his longest sea flight. The French battleship Bruix will follow him.

Vedrines intends afterwards to fly from South America to North America. Although unable to state the exact details, he hopes to fly at several points in the United States. He said:

"In my determination to fly around the world I have always contemplated eagerly a visit to America. I shall make stays in New York and other cities, where I may fly. I do not suppose the sky-scrapers interfere with flights.

"After leaving the United States and embarking, probably at New York, I shall go to Morocco, and fly home to Paris from Tangier."

OTTAWA, January 2.—Mail notice has been given calling attention of the creditors of the Sovereign bank for the afternoon of Wednesday, January 25th, at the office of G. T. Clarkson. The meeting will be followed by a meeting of the shareholders of the bank, the purpose of both meetings being to ascertain the wishes of the creditors and shareholders as to the appointment of liquidators. The call for these meetings is pursuant to the order of Mr. Justice Lennox who, on January 27th will further petition for the winding up of the bank.

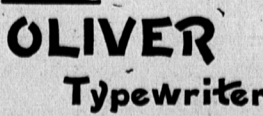

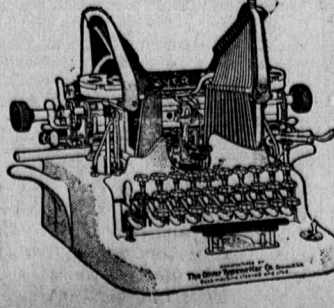
