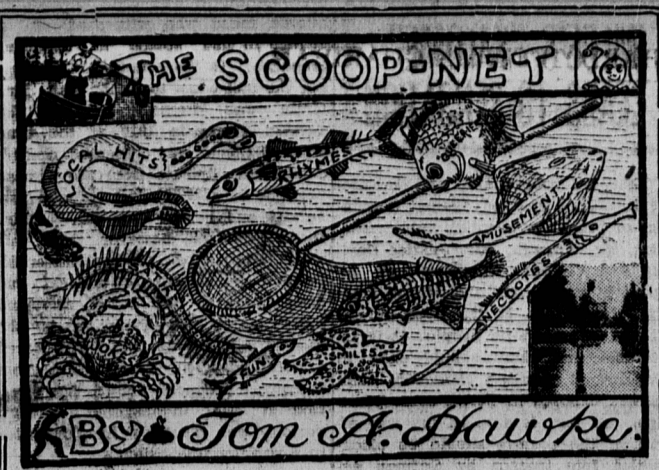

#### AN UNUSUAL OCCURRENCE.

AN ATLANTIC PORT, June 15.—The most rigid investigation ever given the passengers and cargo of a vessel reaching here was begun yesterday upon the arrival of a large Holland-American liner at an Atlantic port with 603 passengers. A squad of forty British customs inspectors, sent by train from Halifax, swarmed on board the vessel when it reached the quarantine station.

This is the first time that British officials have aided in searching a vessel, and there was considerable speculation as to the cause of the unusual proceedings.

The British inspectors were accompanied by more than one hundred army and navy intelligence officers and a full company of searching squad of the customs intelligence bureau. The steamship was anchored in the harbor, and no vessels, not even those carrying officials of the line, were allowed to approach while the examination continued.

### PRISONER OF WAR SENDS THANKS

The following letter which speaks for itself has been received by Miss Florence Norton from the Prisoner of War adopted by the Sunday School of the Grace Methodist Church.

Dear Miss Norton:—I am writing you a few lines today thanking the people of the Grace Church Prisoners of War Relief Society for their aid your kindness and your parcels of food etc. which I received through our Canadian Red Cross from London.

These parcels Miss Norton I received quite regular, and in good condition. Each parcel contained two tins of meat; one of jam, one small tin milk one half pound of sugar, one quarter pound of tea and a small box of whole wheat biscuits. Your parcel Miss Norton I always thought an awful lot of as it came from people near my own home which is in Sussex, New Brunswick and the rest of my Society parcels came from Upper Canada or the Far West hating those from my people and private friends. I wrote you about Xmas time thanking you for our kindness but I never received a reply, so I do not know if you received the letter or not.

I was exchanged from Germany into Holland on the 15th of last month and oh goodness what a change in the people of this country and those of Germany.

We are living about two and a half miles from The Hague and about ten minutes walk from the famous Peace Palace the palace where all the Red Cross and Prisoners exchange. Agreements are signed by our people and the Huns for which the name of Huns is too good for.

This is a very beautiful country with its thousands of winding canals, its lovely gardens, and parks. We are near the sea shore and go for a bath and walk along the sand every morning, this place is also one of the leading summer watering places of Europe. The people of all parts of the world come here for the summer months.
