For many years, Mr. Fred Champion provided excellent light service to O'Leary and Knutsford, including street lighting after the disastrous fire of Feb. 18th the year which saw the complete destruction of the electric light plant, a citizens committee provided an efficient lighting service including street lights. Now the Maritime Electric Co. is giving an excellent service to homes and stores, but no satisfactory agreement has been reached regarding the street lighting. A meeting of the Public Utilities Board will shortly be held to look into the matter of street lights.
