—The latest news, first of all.

—George Riley, Baltic, was in Summerside yesterday.

—The steamer Ryhope is due to arrive in Summerside today from Montreal.

—The Empress took away from Summerside, this week, twenty-eight tons of smelts, all of which go by express to the American market.

—John Clark, proprietor of the Levensdown Hotel, Cape Traverse, who had the misfortune of falling a few days ago and breaking three ribs, is recovering as fast as can be expected.

—Contractor D. A. Morrison, Summerside, arrived from Montreal Thursday night and proceeded to Charlottetown yesterday morning. He says that they will have their contract of building the new round house in Charlottetown completed in about another week.

—Augustine Blackier, Summerside, is seriously ill. On Thursday he was in his usual good health and at bed-time the family retired leaving him reading. About midnight he was discovered lying on the floor unconscious having suffered a severe stroke of paralysis.

—The annual meeting of the Dunk River Farmer's Institute will be held at Lower Freetown, Monday evening the 29th inst. A new board of Directors are to be appointed and a student selected for the college course at Truro. The meeting will be an important one.

—In the report of the Forensic demonstration at Alberton, mention was made of the brief but humorous address of Rev Mr Young of the Baptist Church, who conveyed his good wishes to the order, though not yet a member. The unintentional oversight is much regretted.

—In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying twenty-five cents a dozen for eggs; eight dollars and fifty cents a ton for loose hay four dollars and fifty cents for straw; twenty-five cents per bus for potatoes; forty to forty one cents per bus for oats and eight to eight and three quarter cents per lb for pork.

—Alberton dealers are paying thirty seven cents a bus for white oats and thirty eight cents for black; twenty-one cents a dozen for eggs, twenty cents a pound for butter, nineteen cents a bus for potatoes, ten cents a lb for hides, eight to eight and three quarter cents a lb for pork; ten cents for turnips and eight dollars a ton for loose hay.

**VETERINARY DENTISTRY.**

J. M. Nicholson, Veterinary Dentist, speaks as follows about horses teeth. I have observed where I have been professionally called that a common mistake among horse breeders is not to attend to the second growth of teeth in the colts, and not to examine whether the first ones were shed before the second came. The result of this neglect is ill-grown teeth, indigestion, foul breath, etc., and although the horse may have a good appetite, his food does not seem to nourish him because improperly masticated. All this combined makes a horse what is commonly called a "puker." A wolf tooth in a colt's mouth hurts him when he is litted, and gives him a bad mouth to drive. Many a horse has been called vicious or unmanageable that had bad teeth. Horse Dentistry being relatively a new art, few people are aware of the defects in horses teeth and the remedies which can be successfully applied. Men who wonder why their horses have this or that defect, should have their teeth examined. In some cases out of ten the fault can be cured.

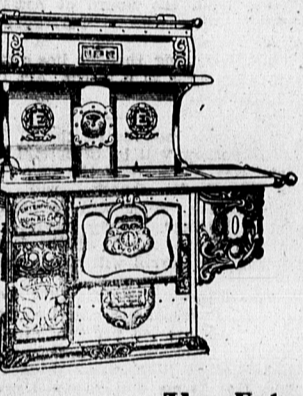

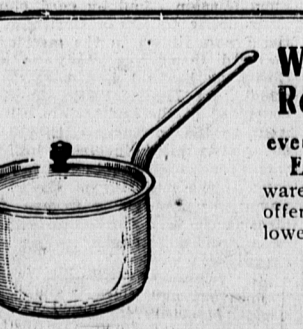
