The town clock, the source of so much annoyance, has at last been made correct and the only question now is as to how long it will maintain the path of rectitude in which it has been placed. Realizing that the time for action had arrived The Guardian representative yesterday afternoon in company with the keeper of the Court House undertook the task of placing our great timepiece in harmony with the clocks of the railway and thus an indicator of the correct Moncton time. The actual Moncton time was ascertained by the railway and telephoned to the Courts Building. Then the newspaper man and the keeper climbed up the tortuous path that led to the pinnacle of the building from which the hour is pealed forth. A few minutes work sufficed to place the clock some ten minutes ahead and thus correct. The task completed and a public duty fulfilled the two descended again and this morning for the first time in a number of weeks the public can look to our town clock with implicit confidence feeling that it is again in unison with the great world beyond our borders.

THE death took place in Georgetown yesterday forenoon of one of its most prominent residents in the person of Angus McLean, after a lingering illness extending over some months. The deceased gentleman was born in New Perth, in 1843 and about 1883 removed to Georgetown, where he was engaged in harness making for a number of years. Subsequently he started a grocery business on the west side of Main street on the premises now owned by W. W. Jenkins and occupied by the Lavers Bros. and F. J. Solomon. He then purchased the Munro property on the opposite side, and after the fire of 1893, in which those buildings and others were destroyed, he acquired the corner property, and erected thereon the present structure, containing his residence and store. In the latter he has carried on successfully a grocery, confectionery and fancy goods business, which, since his illness, has been conducted with success by his only son, Russell R. The late Mr. McLean enjoyed the respect and esteem of all who knew him. He was a public spirited citizen and every measure tending to the welfare of the town had his firm support. His warm hearted disposition, kindly nature and attractive personality won many friends. He was a devoted husband and loving father, whose loss will be deeply felt in the home circle. He leaves to mourn a sorrowing widow, nee Miss LeBrocq, and one son Russell R., in Georgetown, whose news in the Georgetown columns of The Guardian from that locality has been read with interest by many eastern people; two brothers, James and Daniel, and one sister, Mrs. Daniel Robertson in New Perth.
