Makes Concessions To Varsity Co-Ed

OXFORD, England, Nov. 26—Chaperon rules affecting women at Oxford University have been relaxed.

Hitherto an undergraduate could not have a woman undergraduate in his room without a chaperon, but women are now no longer forbidden to go to undergraduates' rooms, whether in colleges or lodgings, during the afternoon.

Increased Yield of Ontario Tobacco

With regard to tobacco culture in Ontario, the Tobacco Service of the Dominion Department of Agriculture reports that the harvesting of flue-cured tobacco in Ontario commenced earlier than usual this year but continued for a longer period because no frost occurred until the last few days of September. For the first time in a number of years the damage from frost was practically nil. In fact, the harvesting season as a whole was very favourable this fall and practically all tobacco in every district was harvested.

There was an increase in acreage planted in all types of tobacco in Ontario in 1935 over that of 1934. The estimated total acreage of flue-cured tobacco is slightly over 30,000 acres as compared with somewhat over 24,000 acres in 1934. The average yield in what is known as the Old Belt is estimated at 900 pounds per acre and in the New Belt at

1,150 pounds per acre. The average yield of all flue-cured tobacco is now estimated at 1,138 pounds per acre, with a total production of 35,000,000 pounds for the province.

There was a larger increase in acreage planted to Burley than to flue-cured tobacco, although the acreage of Burley has been decreasing steadily since 1931. The estimated acreage planted to Burley this season is 8,000, as compared with 6,800 acres in 1934. The average yield of Burley is estimated at 1,500 pounds per acre, making the total production about 10,500,000 pounds. It is an excellent crop and is curing well.
