PROHIBITION AMENDMENTS.

We published yesterday certain amendments to the prohibitory law as proposed and adopted by the Grand Division of the Sons of Temperance, and we commend them to the favorable consideration of the Government and the members of the new Legislature shortly to be elected. We are grateful to the Farquharson Administration for retracing their first wrongful steps in liquor legislation and for affirming the principle of prohibition in the Act passed at the last session of the Legislature. But we have never disguised the fact that the law as it stands contains serious defects.

The amendments proposed by the Grand Division indicate very clearly the principal points in regard to which changes in the law are necessary and the nature of the changes needed to make the law more effective for good. We think these changes ought to be made and they can yet be made before the law goes into operation, as in the usual course of things the new Legislature will meet and will conclude its sitting before that date. It is a good time to direct public attention to these matters that they may have due weight with the temperance community of the Island in making their choice of Candidates for the coming election.

Our public men cannot be too strongly impressed with the fact that the sentiment of the great majority of the people of this Island, and especially of its better and more responsible elements, is overwhelmingly in favor of the entire suppression of the liquor traffic. That fact was attested very strongly both in the provincial plebiscite of 1893 and in the Dominion plebiscite of 1898, the vote being three to one for prohibition in the first case and about nine to one in the second. The same fact has been affirmed in successive Scott Act elections throughout the Island. It is also accentuated by the fact that THE GUARDIAN, the steadfast advocate of prohibition, has had a rapidly extending circulation and an ever expanding and growing influence among the people.

If we are to have, as we trust we shall have, "government of the people, by the people and for the people" we shall have this overwhelming popular sentiment clearly crystallized into law in its most effective form. And we shall have the law backed up by a whole-hearted administration and enforcement of its provisions. To this the people are entitled. With nothing less than this will they, or ought they to be satisfied. A clear note in favor of a perfected prohibitory law, honestly enforced, ought to be heard above the din of mere party

strife in the coming election, and we trust it will be so heard. Let us begin with the first year of the twentieth century by placing an effectual ban upon the liquor traffic once and for ever.

CARLIST RISING A FAILURE.

Two More Spanish Islands Ceded to the United States for \$100,000.

MADRID, November 8.—At a cabinet council held to-day under the presidency of the queen regent, General Azcarraga, the premier, said there was now no Carlist under arms in Spain and that the rising had failed completely. In order, however, to destroy the entire Carlist organization in the country, he said, the suspension of the constitutional guarantees would be maintained.

General Azcarraga also announced that Spanish-American convention had been signed in Washington by which the Islands of Caygayan, and Cibatu, in the Philippine archipelago, had been ceded for \$100,000.

CRAZED BY TASTING TEA.

A Famous Expert Driven Insane by Poison, Commits Suicide by Drinking Carbolic Acid.

CHICAGO, November 8.—Crazed by the constant tasting of tea, Albert P. Upham, one of the greatest tea experts in the world, killed himself recently by drinking carbolic acid.

He was a member of the firm of Sprague Warner & Company, and for twenty-five years, six days in the week, has tested from 50 to 100 samples of tea.

So efficient had Mr. Upham become in his particular line of business that he was known in all the large tea importing houses from coast to coast.

About two years ago, Mr. Upham was taken suddenly ill, and after a narrow escape from death he went into a sanitarium with his health broken down.

Physicians who had charge of the patient said that his constitution had by excessive tea tasting been ruined.

After some months of careful treatment Mr. Upham's condition improved, but he never returned to active business life. At the time of his death he was one of the five government tea experts of the country.
