NEWSY NOTES

An American Golden-Eye After the great storm of Oct. 27, the dead body of a duck-like bird was brought to me for identification. I was not familiar with it, but after considerable research I was able to say that it was an American Golden-eye, a bird I had not previously seen. I went over it point by point and put down my observations as follows: American Golden-eye or Whistler, (Oct. 27, 1945). Bill short, thick, basal half blackish, then an ochreous band and a dark blue "finger-nail" tip. Lower mandible serrated. Head and upper half of neck dark brown. Eye, pupil, dark, rest of the eyeball light yellow. Lower half of neck and upper breast, cinereous (ashy); rest of underbody pure white, but under tail coverts sooty. Back sooty, the feathers edged lighter; rump and tail wholly sooty. Tail feathers short, narrow, and pointed. Wings: coverts sooty, irregularly barred white, inner primaries white, their tips showing as a speculum; outer primaries sooty. Tarsus and toes leaden-colored; hind toe webbed, all webs sooty. Length 16 inches. This was an immature male, as denoted by the bony hump (concealed by feathers) at the base of the bill. The females have similar plumage. Adults males have a circular white spot before the eye. The flesh of these birds, according to some authorities, is said to be "not palatable to man," on account of the bird's diet, shellfish, and in some Latin books where it means that a final m or n is omitted. When the serif is absent (as it often is in capital letters) the type is said to be "sans-serif," that is, without serifs. I am re-reading Sir Walter Scott's romance, "The Monastery."
