MORE MANUFACTURERS WANTED.

Many of our readers will not think it too premature a step to at least seriously consider the advisability of certain manufacturing industries in this Province, especially in view of the establishment of a Car Ferry between Carleton Point and Cape Tormentine at an early date, thus giving us through freight service as in other parts of Canada. Living expenses are decidedly less, wages lower and real estate much cheaper here than in other places, and thus so much greater reason why Prince Edward Island should have many manufacturers. An exchange remarks that Montreal capitalists are looking into the question of establishing an extensive brick making industry in Queen's County, N. B. Very extensive clay deposits of great depth have been discovered there, and a test of the quality has shown that this clay will produce glazed and unglazed terra cotta bricks of the kind now

imported from England. It is said that to establish such a plant as would be required for the proper development of the industry an investment of nearly a million dollars would be required, and that there seems a fair prospect that sufficient capital will be interested to carry out the project. The clay deposits are not far from the extensive coal fields of Queen's County. Even if this Province is not known to enjoy extensive clay deposits as in New Brunswick there are many enterprises that would yield a handsome income on the money invested. And provincialists may be agreeably surprised at the finds if experimental tests are made as to what Prince Edward Island really has beneath its earth's surface. There are many progressive farmers throughout the Province who would gladly invest in good manufacturing plants if shares were placed at about \$10. each as suggested by one of their number.

VIEW WITH ALARM.

Rather late, but none the less heart-felt, is the protest of an American engineering journal against the utilization of the Hudson Bay route by Canada. It will be recalled that about the time Ontario was commencing to develop hydro-electric power on our own side of Niagara Falls, a sudden aesthetic agitation broke out in the United States for the protection of the picturesque beauties of the great cataract—that is, the protection of them on the Canadian side of the river. This protest against opening up the Hudson Bay route has no reference to aestheticism, but is purely humanitarian. This engineering authority declaims in the name of humanity against Canada spending money on a railway to Hudson Bay, because that will mean the opening up of the Hudson Bay route to Europe, and the opening up of that route will mean an awful toll of human lives through grain ships running into icebergs. Of course, ocean freighters do not run along at the rate of 25 miles an hour, fog or fair, light or dark; but the Engineering News estimates that there will be 150 steamers on the route, and adds: "Without doubt, commerce will go wherever profits are to be gained, and men will be found to man vessels wherever owners are willing to risk them; but even though profits were certain, humanity protests against such serious jeopardy in the lives of thousands."

MISJUDGED SITUATION.

LONDON June 13.—The strike leaders have apparently misjudged the situation in calling for a national strike. No man came out today. The only ports seriously affected are Southampton, Bristol, Swansea and Manchester. Of the trouble at Southampton is less a question of supporting the Transport Workers Federation than an outburst of long smouldering local grievances. The government has finally decided to take no parliamentary action but allow the trouble to be fought out by the parties concerned, confining its action to assisting the negotiation in a mediator character.

TO SAFEGUARD PUBLIC HEALTH IN ONTARIO.

The Province of Ontario, far the purpose of safeguarding the public health has been divided into seven districts. The decisive action, based upon legislation passed last session, was taken by the government Saturday. The older portion of the province is given five of the districts, and Northern Ontario the other two. The exact boundaries of the various divisions have not been announced, nor the names of the seven district health officers who will be placed in charge, but the headquarters for each district have been made known. The men upon whose shoulders will fall the bulk of the responsibility for protecting the public health will be big enough for "the job." The government have taken a strong stand upon that point. In addition to selecting their doctors with the greatest deliberation, Hon. W. J. Hanna, provincial health officer, have given careful attention to the means by which their work can be made most effective. Each one of the seven appointed will be required to take a six months' course of instruction in public health, and pass an examination prescribed by the University of Toronto. The university has at the request of the government arranged a special course for the district officers. It will include chemistry, bacteriology, water and sewage, epidemiology, and general public health and sanitary matters.

It may not be generally known that New York now leads cities of the world in its foreign shipping, with Antwerp second and London third. Next come Hamburg, Hong-Kong, Liverpool, Montevideo, Marseilles, Singapore, Cardiff, Kobe, Genoa, and Buenos Ayres. It may be noted that London held first place for generations until a short time ago. Japan has advanced to such an extent in recent years that Kobe, its principal seaport, has now foreign commerce almost half as large as New York, though not a building was erected on the spot where the city now stands until years after Commodore Perry opened Japan to the commerce of the West. New York is however, the only United States seaport which occupies a prominent place in the above connection.
