ELECTROCUTED AS PRISONERS SANG.

OSSINING, N. Y., Feb. 5—While the condemned inmates in the death house in Sing Sing prison softly sang "Safe in the Arms of Jesus," Charles Swanton, a negro, was executed in the electric chair this morning for the murder of Isaac Lee. It was the first time in the history of the prison that the condemned have sung a death dirge while another has paid the penalty of his life. Charles Swanton shot and killed Isaac Lee on the night of November 3, 1910, at the latter's home on West Sixty-ninth street, New York city. Both were negroes.

NO TRACE OF NIAGARA'S VICTIMS.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Feb. 5.—Although watchers were stationed at the Whirlpool Rapids today, it was not expected that the ice-churning waters would soon, if ever, release the bodies of the man, woman and boy who were swept down the gorge with floss from the ice bridge. The appearances of the whirlpool were ugly, and the grinding of the ice jam racing within it echoed through the gorge. Great cakes of ice were being hurled down stream under the bridges where still dangled the ends of the ropes which proved useless in the endeavor to rescue the trio as they were being swept down stream. Nothing developed today to make more certain the identity of the man and woman supposed to be Mr. and Mrs. Eldridge Stanton of Toronto, excepting that these persons had not returned to their hotel. It is known that they started for the ice bridge about an hour before the sudden release of tons of ice below the falls swept it away. The father of Burrill Heacock of Cleveland, the third victim, arrived today. After a look at the ice-piled gorge he said he had no hope of ever seeing the body of his son, who after being drawn by a rope part way up to the Cantilever Bridge, slipped back exhausted into the river.

OPPOSES MODIFICATION OF MARITIME LAWS.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—William Livingston of Detroit, president of the Lake Carriers' Association today opposed before the Merchant Marine and Fisheries Committee of the House, the Wilson Bill modifying the Maritime laws as to the shipment of crews. Mr. Livingston said the proposed removal of punishment of desertions would work a hardship on the coming ocean steamships. Sailors, he said, would contract in foreign ports, where wages were low, only to desert in the United States to get advantage of American wages for the return trip.

SERVIAN CABINET HAS RESIGNED.

BELGRADE, Servia, Feb. 3.—The Servian Cabinet has resigned, the Ministers took this step partly on account of the recent discovery of what is known as the "Blackhand" conspiracy in the army to force King Peter to discuss the radical cabinet, or to abdicate in favor of the Crown Prince. Another reason given for the resignation is that the support afforded by Parliament to the Government has declined considerably.
