**DALVAY ESTATE WAS OVER RATED**

CINCINNATI, Jan. 11.—"Alexander McDonald's wealth has been very much over-rated," said Attorney Charles H. Stoll, representing the Metropolitan Trust Co., of New York City, administrator of the estate of the late Standard Oil magnate, who is here to pay the claims of Cincinnati creditors. "At the time of McDonald's death he was credited with a fortune of \$30,000,000 to \$40,000,000, but in 1900 and 1901, when he was at the crest of his fortune, he held about \$3,678,620 in Standard Oil Stock, besides other securities. The affairs are in a very complicated state, but the Metropolitan Trust Co. is making headway. The estate is not only solvent, but will yield between \$1,500,000 and \$2,000,000 to McDonald's grand-children. The McDonald residence in Clinton has not been sold to J. Pierpont Morgan, as was reported. It is known that McDonald borrowed heavily on his railroad and other securities to raise money to finish the New Orleans, Mobile & Chicago Railroad, which he constructed. Some money was lost in his deal, and from 1901 until the time of his death McDonald sold 1,274 shares of Standard Oil Stock for 764,400. The action of Stoll was taken as a result of an application recently made to probate Judge Lueders by Silas Waters, who had a claim against the estate, to have an administrator for the McDonald estate appointed in Cincinnati. Stoll has settled with Waters and has paid \$180,000 of McDonald's debts here. Surrogate Cahlan revoked yesterday letters of administration of the estate of Alexander McDonald, granted to his partner, Edmund K. Stallo. Stallo's bondsmen, surety companies, got an order Dec. 3rd, requiring him to furnish new bondsmen Dec. 21st. This order was not complied with. Surrogate Cahlan has allowed Stallo twenty days in which to file his accounting as administrator. The McDonald estate is valued at \$1,700,000, the infant daughters of the testator are the principal heirs.

**ST. JOHN WOMAN BEATEN.**

ST. JOHN, Jan. 13.—A daring thief, who entered the residence of Mrs. Normansell, corner of Brittain and Carmarthen Street just after midnight, nearly committed murder to carry out his purpose. Attacking Mrs. Normansell savagely, he beat her over the head with a revolver, endeavoring to choke her and tore her mouth and cheek in an effort to stifle her cries. With her face badly cut, her white night-dress saturated with the blood that flowed from her wounds, Mrs. Normansell made a plucky escape from her murderous assailant, and rushed to the street and sought refuge in a house on the opposite corner. It was one of the worst cases perpetrated in this city in many years, and the police have very little to work on.

**CANADA LABELLED BY ENGLISH JOURNAL.**

OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—In the House of Commons, yesterday several members, mostly Englishmen by birth, condemned the attack on Canada in a recent issue of the English Weekly, "John Bull." **BARBORN MID WOLVES.**

Amid the intermittent calls of a pack of hungry wolves threatening the family which were answered by the cries of her 4-year-old daughter, Mrs. Walter Durrah, Duluth, Minn., 34 years old, who alleges she was deserted by her husband, gave birth six days ago to a baby in a partially roofless shack near Pelican Lake, St. Louis County. The next week she and her two infants were found, surrounded by the most appalling conditions, nearly starved, and the shack surrounded by hungry timber wolves. They were taken to a farm house for protection. For a week previous to the birth of the child, Mrs. Durrah had been critically ill, and only the services of her 4-year-old child were extended to her during that and the ensuing period and up to today, when a hunter, seeking wolf pelts, stumbled across the shack containing the woman and her children. The weather had been extremely cold. There had been no food and no fire in the cabin for the past week, and mother and children were on the point of starvation when found. The little girl had started, barefooted, to a spring for water, with the temperature 19 below. The wolves had surrounded the shack and even crept to the windows and doors.
