Yesterday the Minto crossed from Pictou to Georgetown and brought over eight passengers, 110 bags of mail and a small cargo of freight. The special to this city arrived here about one o'clock. The Earl Grey left this port at the usual time when off Wood Islands sent a wireless to the Marine Department here saying that the ice conditions were such as to prevent the ship from coming back to this port.
