In Memoriam Cornerstone Of New Lidice Laid

WHERE LIDICE WAS. Czecho-slovakia, June 16—(AP)—Five years and five days after Gestapo troops brutally wiped the little village of Lidice off the map, a group of British miners tapped a grey block of granite into place here Sunday as the cornerstone of a new Lidice.

Of the old one, nothing remains save a huge timber cross and a wreath of thorns marking the common grave into which the Nazis dumped the machine-gunned bodies of all the village men—about 178 in all.

This was done because the Kladrno district, Gestapo, whose leaders died on the gallows a few weeks ago in Prague, said the village had harbored the assassins of Reinhard Heydrich, the German Reichs protector whom the Czechs called "der Henker", the hangman.

Several hundred persons besides the survivors assembled for yesterday's ceremony in the grass-covered saddle between two hills where the old Lidice perished and the new one will be raised.

Then he tapped into place a stone marked "Zakladni Kamen Novyho Lidice" which means foundation stone of the new Lidice.

As he did there was a heavy roll of thunder and a downpour began. The eternal flame which was to be lighted in a black cylindrical holder beside the stone was left unlighted until a future time.

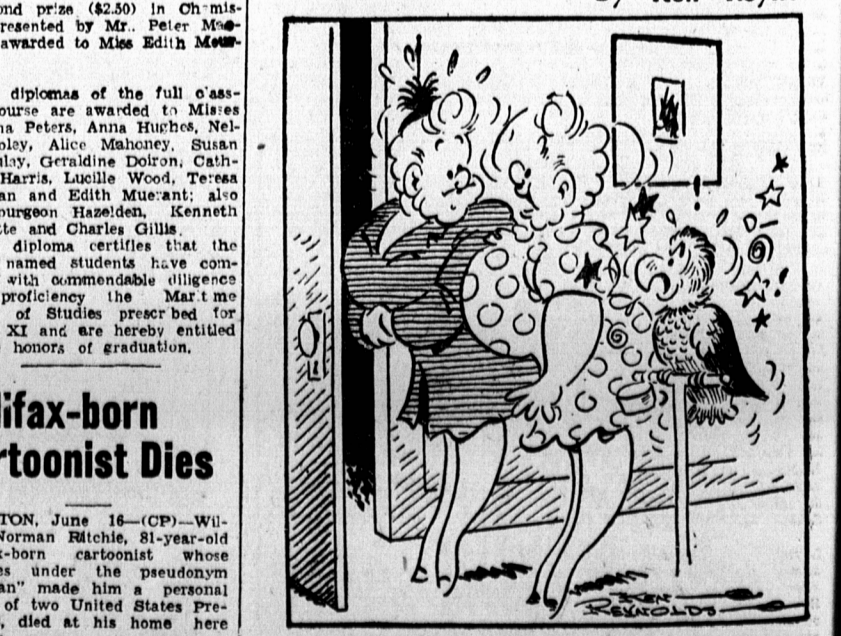
