TAKE TIME TO THINK.

MONTREAL, September 14.—Attacks upon international labor affiliations were today the marked feature of the convention of the Canadian Federation of Labor, and the methods of the United States unions came in for a good deal of criticism all along the line. Incidentally there was a good deal of talk as to the possibility of extending the sphere of influence of the Canadian federation.

Deputy McNeil who was in charge of the work of extending the P. W. A., amongst all Canadian miners, strongly denounced the efforts of United States organizers in Cape Breton and Nova Scotia during the strike troubles.

A report was presented in favor of the formation of a purely Canadian miners' organization, but the convention took a conservative view of the whole matter and the general feeling was that careful investigation of western conditions should be made before any move was taken, the federation being comparatively weak in the west, where most of the mining bodies are, outside of the far east.

A move was made by delegate Teague of Ottawa, for approval by the convention of the government's naval policy, but this met with sharp opposition, and it is not improbable that the matter will be brought up again.

SUGAR TRUST OFFICIALS SENTENCED TO PRISON.

NEW YORK, Sept 14—Ernest W. Caelbracht, former superintendent of the Williamsburg Refinery of the sugar trust who, with Charles B. Heike, former secretary and treasurer of the Sugar Trust, was convicted last spring of conspiracy to defraud the government of the underweighting of sugar, was today sentenced to two years in the federal penitentiary at Atlanta—and fined \$5,000 by Judge Martin in the United States court. After imposing sentence, Judge Martin granted a stay on appeal and fixed bail at \$25,000. Sentence on Mr Heike, who has been called the "Man higher up" is still pending. The conviction of Heike and Caelbracht was in a large measure brought about by the testimony of Oliver Spitzer, former dock superintendent, who, followed his conviction and the serving of a part of his sentence in Atlanta, turned state evidence. Spitzer was pardoned by President Taft.

SWINDLED NEW YORK BANK OF \$100,000

NEW YORK, Sept 14—Adolphe Rothbarth, of the firm of Martin Rothbarth & Company, hop dealers, with offices in London, Frankfurt and St Petersburg, pleaded guilty today to the larceny of \$100,000 from the Mercantile National Bank, and was held for trial in an equal amount of bail. He had been under surveillance forty-eight hours, and his arrest occurred after a long conference between the district attorney's office and a coterie of bankers with whom he has had dealings. "Your honor," said the assistant district attorney in charge of the case, "although the specific sum named in this complaint is only \$10,000, the actual amount this bank alone has lost will come to more than \$100,000."

WORLD'S CHAMPION WALKER.

TORONTO, September 12—George Goulding, the Canadian walker, is now a world's champion, having beaten E. J. Webb, of the Herne Hill Harriers, London, England, in both the one-mile and three-mile walks at the big exhibition track meet Saturday afternoon.

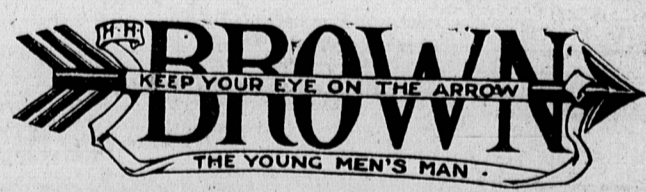
