RAILWAY GIVEN UNTIL MARCH 30 TO FILE PLANS.

BOSTON, Feb. 28—The failure of the Southern New England Railway, a part of the Grand Trunk system to file any public plans and specifications for its projected extension to Boston, resulted in a lively debate yesterday between counsel for the road and members of the legislative committee on railroads.

Counsel for the road admitted that the provisions of the law requiring such plans have not been fulfilled, but pointed out that the making public of the exact route would result in a large increase in the expense of construction and that the legislature should waive the provisions in view of the public benefit.

Several members of the committee disagreed with counsel. The committee late yesterday afternoon voted to give the Southern New England until March 30 to file plans, maps and specifications, and to advertise the route in the towns through which the projected line is to pass.

DELICIOUS CHOCOLATE PIE FILLING.

Many of the best cooks have discovered that the use of cocoa instead of chocolate greatly improves the flavor, and is also more economical.

Use one cup of milk, two heaping tablespoons of Fry's Cocoa, three-quarters cup of sugar, yolks of three eggs and one level teaspoon of corn starch dissolved in a little water. Mix well, and flavor with vanilla. Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Pour over undercrust which has been already baked, and use the whites of eggs for the meringue. Put in the oven again to brown the meringue. Try this and see if the folks do not vote it "just delicious."
