PUMPS STOPS EARTH SLIDES COURT VERDICT IS AWAITED

PANAMA, Oct. 3, (Special)—An interesting method of preventing earth slides into the Panama Canal is being tried successfully in the vicinity of Culebra Cut. It is a system of counter sluicing, which starts the movement of the loose earth away from the canal, instead of toward it. A sluice running parallel to the east bank of the canal for nearly a mile, at an average distance of about 1,500 feet, was discovered several months ago. Realizing that another slide was imminent, and that it would block the channel and delay the opening of the canal for another year, Colonel Goethals conceived the scheme of changing the direction of the sliding movement. Running water was the agent selected. H. O. Cole, engineer in charge of the fifth division, had a hydraulic plant installed back of Gold Hill. The Obispo River then was dammed where it flowed through a tract of low ground. This created a swamp, in which the water soon rose to a level high enough to afford a supply for sluicing purposes.

At the edge of the canal were installed two pumps, and a forty-inch water main was laid from there up an incline to the high ground back of Gold Hill. This main supplies several monitors, from the nozzles of which streams of water issue at a pressure of about eighty pounds to the square inch. The loose earth played upon by these streams is rapidly dissolved and carried by flumes down to the swamp. The counter sluicing operation removes about one hundred thousand cubic yards of earth a month, and at about one-sixth the cost of steam operations. The direction of the slide apparently has been changed and the canal, it seems, is no longer in danger.

LONDON, Oct. 3, (Special)—The Cuban Ports Company at its meeting here resolved to add the names of several shareholders to the recently appointed committee with a view of strengthening it in the negotiations with the Cuban government. The officials of the company emphasized the necessity of impressing the Cuban government that the City of London felt insecure in regard to Cuba and that the door for financing Cuban enterprises was closed. It was intimated during the meeting that as soon as the decision of the Cuban Supreme Court in relation to the dissolution of the contract between the Cuban Ports Company and the Cuban government had been pronounced the company would sue the Cuban government for damages in the civil courts.

CHICAGO, Ill., Oct. 3.—Real football will take the stage tomorrow, with many contests scheduled on college gridirons in the middle and western States. The opening in this section will be most important, as Chicago, Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois, Nebraska, Missouri, and several of the other big State institutions will inaugurate their schedules.

Chicago and Indiana will clash at Marshall Field, while Northwestern and Lake Forest will meet at Evanston. Illinois is scheduled to play Kentucky State at Urbana and Michigan will have a game for an opponent at Ann Arbor. Wisconsin and Lawrence will play at Madison, Nebraska and Washburn at Lincoln, Missouri and Columbia at Columbia, Purdue and Wabash at Purdue, Ohio State and Notre Wesleyan at Columbus, and Notre Dame at Ohio Northern. The State Teachers' College at Iowa City. Minor contests will include those of Coe and Drake at Des Moines; Cornell College and Iowa Wesleyan at Mount Vernon. Western Reserve and Mount Union at Cleveland, and DePauw and Moore's Hill at Greencastle.

Farther West, the University of South Dakota will line up against Nebraska Wesleyan at Vermillion, and the University of Montana will play Montana State College at Missoula.

Deceased was an adherent, member and organist of the Roman Catholic Church. For several years she had been in the employ of Messrs. S. M. Hilda and S. J. Bernard, as bookkeeper, and clerk in their store at Kinkora. Integrity, honesty, faithfulness and punctuality has marked her short but virtuous career. She had been ailing about three weeks, from leakage of the heart, when complications set in and despite the skill of her nurse Miss Caswell and her physician, Dr. J. McPhee, she gradually sank until the end came on Friday, Sept. 26th. One of the largest funeral processions ever seen in Kinkora proceeded to St. Maltehas Cemetery on Sunday afternoon. The funeral service in the church and at the grave was conducted by her Pastor Rev. J. J. McDonald, by whom she was attended throughout her illness and from whose hand she received the last rites of her church ere her soul took its flight. She leaves to mourn, besides her sorrow-stricken parents, three brothers and three sisters, Emmet in Vancouver, B. C., Edwy, Florence, Dallas and Ethel at home.
