ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

The express arrived last night at ten o'clock.

The steamer Elliot arrived safely at Carbonar, Newfoundland, having been detained by fogs and snow storm.

SERVICES in Cardigan Presbyterian Church next Sabbath will be conducted by Rev. R.G. Sinclair, Montague.

THE Princess which was delayed on account of the storm arrived in port yesterday morning at 5.30 and left again, at nine. She returned again last night at nine o'clock.

Among the produce arrivals yesterday was the Marion, Captain Conrad from Charlottetown with 2,250 bushels of potatoes and 380 bushels of turnip.—Halifax Herald.

THE City of London brought a large cargo of general merchandise from West River to the city yesterday morning. She returned in the evening with a cargo including twenty hogs for Davis & Fraser.

THE entertainment in St. Paul's school room last night was fairly well attended and most enjoyable. An excellent musical program was given and the charades formed an interesting variation to the evening's enjoyment.

THE S. S. Coban of which Messrs. Peake Bros & Co are agents, finished loading a full cargo of produce, cattle and sheep, etc. last evening for St. John's, Newfoundland. She sailed at seven o'clock this morning direct. Her outward cargo from here included 9,149 bags oats, 595 bags potatoes, 2,539 bales hay, 163 bbls pork, 126 bbls vegetables, 110 cases eggs, 140 boxes butter, 25 head cattle, 103 sheep, four boxes pigs and sundry other freight. The principal shippers were Carvell Bros, N. Battenbury, E. Wheatley, J. Wheatley, Dominion Packing Co., Davis & Fraser, B. Henderson, Jos. Wis and J. A. Farquarson & Co. This is the last sailing of the Black Diamond Line Steamers from here this season.

Browne, B. A., of North River. Considering the inclemency of the weather the attendance was unusually large; the audience was representative and deeply interested. The learned lecturer treated his subject under the following heads: What are sun spots? What their causes, office, effects, what causes the periods of sun spots, and what is the prophesy of sun spots? We regret that time and space do not permit of an extended notice of this latest effort of an always welcome contributor to the Society's transactions. After remarks by the President, Mr. MacSwain, Rev. Mr. White, Rev. G. P. Raymond, Messrs. Donll and Newson a vote of thanks was unanimously accorded the reverend and learned lecturer.
