

MR. YOUNG'S LECTURE.—An interesting lecture was given in the Presbyterian Church at Alberton, on Monday evening, when the Rev. Luther Young, the churches representative in the mission field of Corea, gave a talk on his work in that country, and a description of the manners and customs of the people. Corea is under the rule of Japan, and has a population of a million and a half people. This is the portion of the heathen world given to the Presbyterian Church for the purpose of spreading among the people the doctrines of the Christian religion. Mr. Young told of his efforts to learn their language, and the method employed in doing so. He secured the services of a native teacher who went around with him, and who continually repeated short sentences of their language until he became familiar with it. He also sang hymns in their language, which was set to music familiar to all of us who attend church today. As in other heathen lands the lot of the girls is a hard one, their advent into the world is taken as a matter of mourning and not of joy. The study of the Scripture among them will have its influence for good, for wherever it goes, in its wake always follow better conditions for the oppressed, male or female.—A
