**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**CHICAGO, Feb. 15 (AP)** — Grains were weak from the start in futures markets today and at times wheat was off as much as a cent and rye was down sharply.

**WINNIPEG, Feb. 15 (CP)** — Eye futures advanced nearly a cent in early trading today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with the May posting a new seasonal high of 1.26 5-8.

**TORONTO, Feb. 15 (CP)** — Following a moderately soft early tone, the Stock Market developed strength in the late period to show index gains at the close for the golds and Western Oils. Base Metals were down 17 at the close.

**LONDON, Feb. 15 (Reuters)** — The continued good war news imparted a cheerful note to Stock Markets today and a fair amount of business was put through. In the industrial market stock shares early became the centre of attraction.

**NEW YORK, Feb. 15 (AP)** — Rails led the stock market on a swift last-hour recovery push today, after considerable profit-cashing irregularity in the forenoon, and the over-all average hit another high mark for the past seven years.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 7 of a point at 61.4, a peak since Sept. 4, 1937. Transfers totalled approximately 1,870,000 shares compared with 2,090 Wednesday.

**MONTREAL, Feb. 15 (CP)** — Securities made a garrison finish in transfers today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market after showing some hesitation at the half-way mark. The trading box score showed 54 issues were higher at the end of the session, 35 were losers and 60 were unchanged.

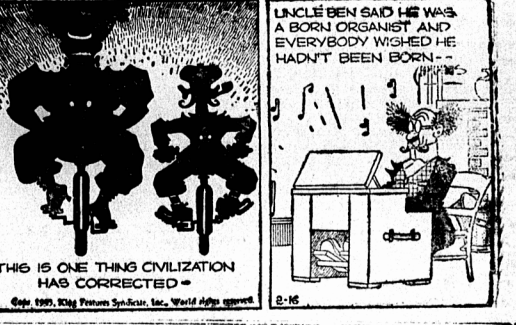
**WEATHER VAGARIES**
