THREE KILLED IN TRAIN CRASH

VANCOUVER, Nov. 18.—(Special)—Three men were killed in the wreck of a C. P. R. freight which ran into a washout near Lyton. The locomotive and three cars plunged over the bank into a gully. Engineer Brown and Fireman Richter of Kamloops met death and brakeman Clarence Anderson was scalded and died in the afternoon. Anderson belonged to Chatham, N. B.

RIGHT TO SEARCH HUSBY'S POCKET

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—(Special)—Woman has rights, and they include that of searching her husband's pockets, according to a decision of Judge Muldowney. The defendant, George Ridgway, was arrested on his wife's complaint that he threatened to knock her head off and objected to his wife taking liberties with his pockets while he slept.

SIX MEN KILLED IN A COAL MINE

PITTSBURG, Pa., Nov. 17.—Six men were killed in an accident at Ellsworth coal mine number one in Washington County late yesterday. Because of a break in the machinery a cage occupied by ten men, several of whom were mine officials, plunged from near the outlet to the bottom of the shaft, a distance of two hundred and eighty-five feet. Three of the occupants of the cage were unhurt while the lives of six were dangerously injured.

HOW FRANCE VIEWS IT

PARIS, Nov. 17.—The French people are watching keenly the Kaiser's embroilment with his own people over the recent interview on Anglo-German relations. The newspapers here contend that the misrepresented condition of affairs during the Boer War and that his real motives in acting as he did were not those he suggests, but were actually prompted by an endeavour to involve England in further trouble. So far as France is concerned the only effect of the interview has been to cement the friendship with England.
