PREMIER GAVE NO PLEDGE THAT GOVT. WOULD SETTLE THE IRISH QUESTION.

LONDON, Dec. 4.—Premier Lloyd George gave no pledge of any kind to the American representatives at the peace conference that in consideration of the question of Irish self-government not being dealt with by the conference the British would, as soon as possible after the signature of the peace treaty, settle the Irish question on a home rule basis.
