POLICE COURT — At the City Police Court yesterday morning a man charged with possession of counterfeit ration coupons (sugar) and acquiring goods with unauthorized coupons was remanded one week. Bail was set at \$500 and two securities of \$1000 each. A party charged with the theft of soldiers' kit bags, was remanded until Thursday. Finding guilty to a charge of possession of spirits, under the Excise Act, the accused in an adjourned case was remanded until Tuesday 6 Nov. for sentence. Charges were withdrawn in the case of two others under the Excise Act.

40-2, AP & B M, C 20. Graded shipments delivered Charlottetown AL 40, AM 41, AP & B M, C 20. Specialized producers are receiving for cartoned peak AL 40; AM 40; AP & B. Poultry appears to be increasing in volume. Deliveries of fowl are now declining with chicken increasing. Prices remain the same. Quality of poultry could show improvement.

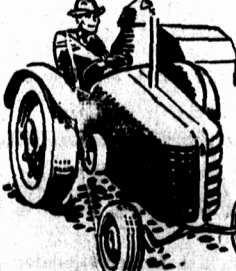
