A convenient and interesting sewing stand, reminiscent in appearance of English colonial days, seen recently at a shop where beautiful trimmings are made, consists of a spinning pole of mahogany held upright by three legs which rest on a slightly raised, a tall four candlestick or lamp. It is fitted with a mahogany workbasket in open spindle effect and below that a revolving spool box, divided into four sections with lids that may be lifted up.
