As the parachute settles the experienced man guides it by tilting it here and there in order to avoid objects underneath. Some men are so expert that if the air be perfectly still they drop back on the lot from which they went up. Ordinarily, a parachute will drop a man 100 feet before it falls. As it begins to fill the decent becomes less rapid, and when it finally opens full size the aeronaut knows it by the sharp snap of the canvas.
