At the home of the bride's grand parents, Georgetown, on April 16th, Miss Hildah McDonald, of Georgetown, was united in marriage to Lawrence Langell, of Pictou, N. S., by Rev. E. A. McPhee.

Last week Premier Haszard and Hon. J. H. Cumiskey were waited upon by a delegation consisting of R. R. Jenkins, Seymour Knight, and Peter Ross of Georgetown. The matter of the Georgetown-Lower Montague ferry was discussed and it is understood that the Government will renew the contract with the Georgetown Ferry Company, giving the same subsidy \$2,200 as last year, from the opening of navigation until the end of December. If the boat ran after that date, an additional subsidy at the rate of \$275 per month would be paid. Mr. Jenkins, the spokesman for the delegation, presented his case clearly and strongly, and when informed of the decision of the Government, expressed his satisfaction at the arrangement. The delegation also presented petitions asking for a steamer on the Cardigan Ferry. This matter will be considered by the Government. The delegation was appointed at a meeting of the Georgetown assessors.

The schr. G.H. Plummer, Capt. Miller which had been laid up at Georgetown all winter, sailed from there on Saturday for Port Hastings.

Nathaniel McLaren, one of the valuers of the Transcontinental Railway returned today from Chipman, New Brunswick. He will remain at Montague until the first of May unless ordered back sooner.

Almost all the lobster fishermen at Murray Harbor ran their lines yesterday morning. This is one of the earliest openings of the season in that locality. Last year it was April 27th, but ten years ago, before the opening date was set by law it was April 18th.

A grand meeting of Lots 27-28 Institute was held at Albany on April 14th. The meeting was called to order by the Pres. G. W. Cameron who in a few remarks announced that owing to the change of Railway timetable, the speaker of the evening Mr. Edwards would be a little late in arriving at the meeting but they could take up some other business while waiting. A letter from the Com. of Agriculture asking this institute to express themselves on the proposed Dog tax. A motion to drop sec. 20 of the act which provides that no compensation be allowed for lambs or sheep killed on a public highway or unenclosed lands was on being put to the meeting lost. A motion moved by John Dawson sec. by F. Boulter that this meeting approve of the proposed Dog act with a tax of \$1 for each dog and \$2 for each bitch, was passed. It was decided to hold a picnic during the coming summer, limited to Institute members and their families. Mr. Edwards now came in and was heartily cheered as he took his place on the platform. In his address the speaker dealt with the dairy question and claimed that to make a success of it a man must be willing to put himself into the business and also not to keep too many cows or raise more calves than can be properly fed. His contention was that a good cow will give 10 lb of milk for every lb of Hay she eats in the shape of good hay. He also made a strong plea for co-operation in the dairy industry showing that the welfare of the country depends upon it for if the farmers do not stand by the factor they will go down and the result will be poor prices for the dairy products. Mr. Edwards spoke on several other matters before closing. After his address about an hour was spent in discussion during which he answered many questions as to his methods of feeding and caring for his cows. At the close a vote of thanks was unanimously given to Mr. Edwards for his instructive address.
