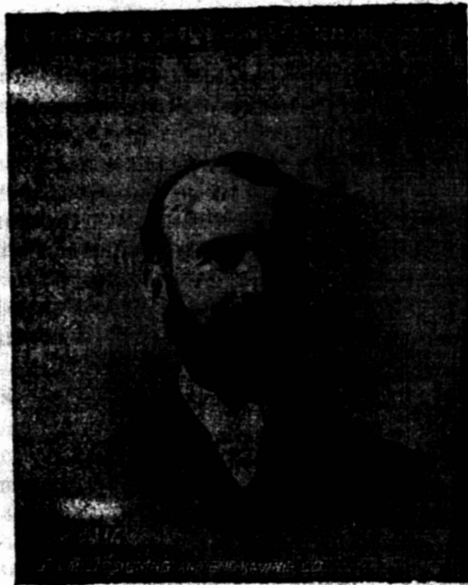
At the Y. meeting this evening the subject will be "White Shield Work. Every member is urged to be present as the meeting will be an important one. Meeting opens at 7 o'clock.

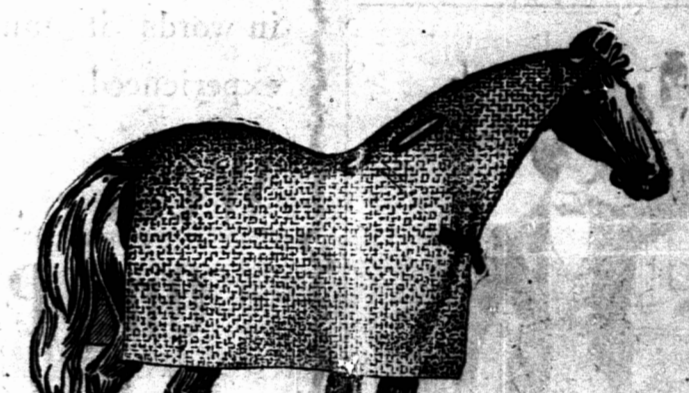
