THE EMPIRE GROWS.

By the recent deal in South Africa, briefly referred to in these columns a week ago, a large area has been added to the domain of the British South African Company. The newly acquired possession is the Kingdom of Barotse, on the upper Zambesi, hitherto ruled by King Lewanika. The King is described as a well-behaved old gentleman who has profited by missionary teachings and has concluded that his safest and most prudent course is to become a British subject. He has had built for him a large house in European style, which his subjects believe to be the finest palace in the world, being the richest their eyes have ever gazed upon.

The new acquisition is described as possessing much fertile territory, and brings British South Africa in touch with the Congo Free State on the north, and with German and Portuguese West Africa on the west.

The region of the upper Zambesi possesses some remarkable physical features, including the great Victoria Falls, which in grandeur are only second to those of Niagara. These falls were first seen by a white man when Livingstone visited them in 1855 and gave them their present name. Only in volume of water, do they fall short of the great Canadian cataract, while the fall is of much greater altitude. The Victoria Falls are 360 feet in height and 1,000 yards in breadth. Niagara Falls are 150 to 164 feet in height and 4,750 feet across. When the railway system of South Africa gives easy access to the Zambesi country the Victoria Falls will attract thousands of visitors annually.

The strait of Canso causes a break between the railway systems of Nova Scotia and Cape Breton. The North Sydney Herald claims that the strait can be easily bridged and at much less cost than the bridging of the St Lawrence above Quebec which, it seems is to be undertaken. The opinion of a competent engineer would be of more value than an editorial opinion on that point.

After a long period of hostile tariff and commercial war France and Italy have now agreed upon a sort of reciprocity treaty granting mutually favorable conditions for the exchange of commodities. Manufactures of silk are not included. The treaty is thought to be of so much importance as to weaken the triple alliance between Germany, Austria and Italy, and also to weaken the accord between Russia and France.

Persia is again attracting attention as the field of Russian designs. The ancient kingdom though much fallen into decay, has still an area of 628,000 square miles and a population of 9,000,000. Russia stripped her of Persian Armenia in 1827, and is hungry for more. Persia to next neighbor to Turkey on the west, Russia on the north and Afghanistan and Bahuchistan on the east. Russia's need of a southern port makes Persia an especially desirable acquisition which would give her outlets on the Persian Gulf and the Arabian Sea.

Despite the poverty of the Sultan he spent vast sums in the entertainment and honors bestowed upon the German Kaiser. An exchange tells that more than \$600,000 was spent on a kiosk for the Kaiser's use. In this sum the cost of the furniture is not included. To the garrison was supplied new uniforms at a cost of \$200,000, exclusive of the price of the cloth. The Sultan's presents to the Kaiser and his wife alone cost about \$600,000. And these were only the carefully prepared gifts; many others of great value were bestowed in a casual manner. For instance, the coverlet on the Empress's bed had the imperial crown and monogram in the centre embroidered in diamonds and pearls. On Her Majesty expressing her admiration of the work, the coverlet was immediately presented to her.

During the progress of the Philippine rebellion some years ago Spain borrowed \$40,000,000 for the purpose of suppressing it. The money was borrowed at 6 per cent, but the Spanish credit was not then good enough to float its 6 per cents at par. The loan only realised \$38,500,000 and, of course, not a dollar of it was expended for improvement of the Islands. It is this transaction that gives rise to the proposal for indemnity on the part of the United States. The Philippine loan was secured by pledging the revenues of the Islands. The United States has offered \$20,000,000 if Spain will peacefully cede the Islands. Even should this sum or twice its amount be accepted by Spain she will probably be forced to repudiate the greater part of her vast debt that was secured upon the revenues of the Philippines, Cuba and Porto Rico.
