FAMINE AND SMALLPOX PREVAIL AT SAN KIANG

Three Hundred Thousand Destitute Persons Driven Back Towards Their Homes

SHANGHAI, Jan. 18.—To the horrors of famine have been added an outbreak of smallpox among the refugees at Sing Kiang, necessitating the demolition of the mat sheds erected to shelter the thousand who have arrived there in search of food. Captain Kitson, who was sent out by the relief committee to investigate the situation, reports that three hundred thousand destitute persons have been driven back towards their homes, and that terrible scenes are being enacted along the line of retreat. He estimates that a quarter of a million persons are likely to be doomed at Sing Kiang alone, and four hundred thousand at Anung, where small relief works have been started. The official records, however, are generally puerile and inaccurate. The distress is largely due to lack of means of communication, and fear that Chinese officials might appropriate any works they might undertake. The dikes being dilapidated, renewed rains are certain to cause fresh floods. Every house in the neighborhood of Anung visited by Captain Kitson contained dead bodies or dying persons. The relief committee, which has 150,000 taels at its disposal, has instituted relief work under foreign supervision.

VETOES CHANNEL TUNNEL PROJECT

LONDON, Jan. 18.—In compliance with a necessary formality in connection with certain private bills submitted to parliament, War Secretary Haldane has announced his dissent from the scheme to construct a tunnel under the British channel, to connect England and France.
