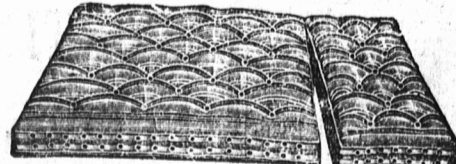

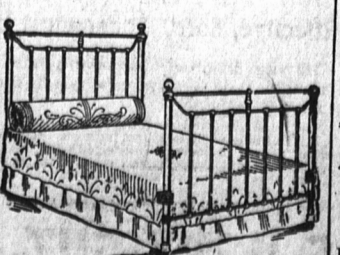

CAPT. SALMON, INMATE OF NEW YORK TOMBS PRISON.

Head of Fishery Protection Makes Serious Charges Against Former Friend in Regard to Mrs. Spain, from Whom He is Separated—Woman Declares She is the Victim of a Plot—Tells Story of Her Troubles While Living in Ottawa and Shows Letter of Her Friend, Lady Minto—Salmon Promises Startling Disclosures. Principals Well Known in Charlottetown.

NEW YORK, June 28.—The World newspaper today devotes the greater part of two pages with photographs, fac-similes of letters and so on, to an ex-parte presentation of the case of Capt. Reginald Salmon and Mrs. Spain, wife of Capt. Osprey G. V. Spain, who is styled "Canadian wreck commissioner and commander of Canadian cruisers."

The story is written from the view point of sympathy with Salmon and Mrs. Spain and depicts them as much persecuted persons, the victims of a conspiracy in which prominent Dominion government officials figure. A letter of sympathy from Lady Minto received by Mrs. Spain in New York is reproduced in fac-simile. The story is headed "Scandal in high life in Canada revealed here," and the World calls the case "an amazing scandal of international proportions involving the Hon. Raymond Prefontaine, Canadian minister of marine; Captain Osprey G. V. Spain, present Canadian wreck commissioner and commander of Canadian cruisers and his wife, Mary Beatrice Spain, for years a leader of government house society in Ottawa and the close personal friend of Lord and Lady Minto."

The section of the penal code under which he is held on this charge has been so long forgotten that in the memory of most lawyers here nobody has been prosecuted under it. There is another charge against Capt. Salmon too, that of collusion in an illegal operation upon Mrs. Spain. A Brooklyn physician is held with Salmon on this charge. The effort of the World is to show that the charges are the result of vindictiveness on the part of Capt. Spain, aided by his "powerful friends among high Canadian Government officials."

The newspaper speaks of the case as "a conspiracy, hatched in the highest official circles of Canada, to wreck and dishonor Salmon's career and to blight the reputation of the defenseless woman he has ventured to befriend."

whereabouts. "On the floor of the house the accused minister of marine has, in answer to these questions, stated that all he knew of his accuser was when he had gone from Ottawa to New York city. "But so far as the records show Prefontaine did not tell the inquiring members that Capt. Osprey G. V. Spain, the man he had selected to succeed Capt. Salmon as Canadian wreck commissioner, had quietly proceeded to New York where he employed detectives and lawyers and finally succeeded in landing Salmon in jail under charges supported by alleged confessions which promised to be the subject of the gravest inquiry. "It will be news for the Canadian House of Commons that Salmon is a prisoner behind the bars, and that Mrs. Mary Beatrice Spain, the brilliant society leader of a year ago and the close friend of Lady Minto, is charged as the captain's accomplice in criminal acts."

Salmon's lawyer makes serious charges. Terrible things are in store for somebody, according to a published interview with one of Salmon's lawyers, Thomas S. Morgan, who says: "The captain's defence will unmask the operations of one of the most powerful and lawless political rings known to modern history. "Money has been sent in volume over the Canadian border to accomplish the downfall of this honest man and reputable woman. "I think we shall be able to find out exactly the source of this flood of money, and other things which will profoundly interest English and Canadian society and U. S. the Canadian parliament as well. "There will be local revelations of hardly less interest and importance showing how the Canadian foe of Capt. Salmon and Mrs. Spain prepared and sprang their little traps in this city so quietly and effectively that no hint of it has ever slipped across the Canadian border to embarrass the governmental ring. "Five columns of solid matter are devoted to the story of Mrs. Mary Beatrice Spain, who is described as "a delicately modelled woman, with blue gray eyes and small regular features that denote high breeding in every line. She talks in a low well modulated voice with a slight English accent."

Mrs. Spain is at present living in a cheap apartment on Second avenue, where she was when Salmon was arrested. She came here last fall, and Salmon came soon after. The gist of her story is that she was compelled to leave her husband because of his unkindness to her and that Captain Salmon befriended her in a purely platonic way. The lady is made to say: "My social position at the Canadian capital was of the assured sort. His excellency, Lord Minto, was my friend, while Lady Minto, his wife, showed me every mark of kindness and confidence. I have here her last letter to me."
