RECENTLY Allan Robertson, of Mount Hope, sold to James D. McInnis of St. Peters, agent for the pork packing establishment, Charlottetown, nine bacon hogs, the aggregate weight of which was 1870 lbs. The snug sum realized by the sale, was very satisfactory to the feeder when taking into consideration the age of the hogs, which was six months and three days at the time they were shipped, Feb 23th. They were of Yorkshire breed.

LAST week the intelligence received at Dundas that Mr. Norman MacLeod, eldest son of Mr. Roderick MacLeod, of Bridge-town, had been killed at Sydney east a gloom over this neighborhood. Mr. MacLeod left Dundas about a year ago and had been for a short time in the employment of the Dominion Iron and Steel Co. of Sydney. On Tuesday, Feb. 12th, instead of taking the usual road from his boarding house to his workshop he walked on the railway track, and on the journey was overtaken by a train, knocked down, and received such injuries that he died two days after. It appears that the driver of the engine saw Mr. MacLeod on the track and blew the alarm whistle three times but Mr. MacLeod being a deaf-mute did not hear. After the accident he was carried into the house of Mr. Dunlop where he was attended by Dr. Boardman on whose advice he was sent to the D. I. and S. Company's hospital. On examination it was found that one of his legs was broken, his skull fractured and his body dreadfully mutilated. In spite of the best medical skill employed, after two days suffering he succumbed to his injuries. He was buried in the Presbyter-ian cemetery, the funeral being attended by relatives and friends from P. E. I. resident in Sydney. His respected parents and relatives here who in his death have sustained such a sudden and painful bereavement, have the sympathy of the entire community and our prayer is that God will be with them in their Gethsemane and enable them resignedly to say "not our will but Thine be done." "God calls our loved-ones but we lose Not wholly what He hath given; We live on earth in thought and deeds As truly as in heaven."

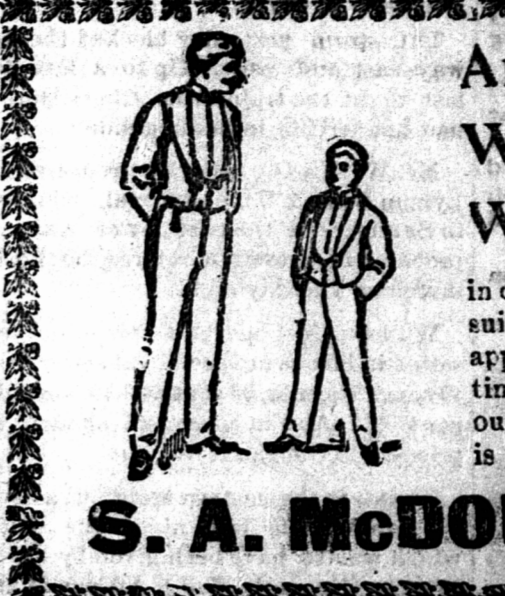
