A YARMOUTH Despatch 19th says:—The schooner Clifford C. from St. John, N. B., for Charlottetown, P. E. I., with a cargo of oil, put into Westport on Tuesday and anchored. During the gale of Wednesday the chain of the anchor parted and the vessel was in danger of going ashore. The captain slipped the other chain and put to sea. She put into Yarmouth Sound the same afternoon, misstayed and having lost her anchor as above stated, struck on the "Hen and Chickens" The steamer La Tour towed her off and brought her up to Baker's wharf. She is leaking badly and will be obliged to discharge her cargo and go on the slip for repairs.

Our citizen soldiers are returning from South Africa and will soon be here. At the call of their country they went forth as our representatives to maintain the supremacy of the British Empire that empire of which we are proud to form a part. It was a proud day on which we saw them depart for we were in high anticipation that whatever they undertook to do they would do it. And do it they did at Paardeburg and St. Helena testify! There was no flinching in the presence of the foe, nor a laggard to be found when the difficulties, privations, and dangers incident to a soldier's life on the veldt had to be faced. We have read the records with mingled feelings of pleasure and of pain—pleasure because of their heroic work for Queen and Country, and of pain when we read of their privations, sufferings and death. Oft times without food or shelter "we have stood all night in the cold storm with our backs to the rain like you have seen the horses on the Island," wrote one heroic lad. Then came long marches, without the necessary food or water, under a blistering sun. Like the good soldiers of other days they "endured hardships," and these privations and sufferings have been vicarious. While we remained in our comfortable homes our substitutes were uncomplainingly suffering upon the open veldt that the honor of Canada and the old flag might be upheld. But now our boys are returning and what are we going to do about it? Shall we not, one and all, second every effort put forth by those in authority to make the home-coming as enjoyable to them as possible. With this object in view the officers of our militia are sparing neither time nor money. Among other things they are tendering the returning contingent a complimentary banquet. This is as it should be and we are sure that all our leading citizens will consider it an honor and a privilege to sit at that banquet-table with those noble fellows and thus demonstrate that Charlottetown is proud of her victorious sons.

Two of the cows each gave more than 40 lbs. milk daily from June 1st, to August 25th, after which no record was kept. The average daily yield of the whole herd during that time was upwards of 32 pounds each. The individual yield of each cow together with percentage of butter fat can be seen on the premises.

CAMPAIGN ORATORY.

The question has been raised whether or not the plentiful campaign oratory is effective in changing the votes of electors. But it is quite certain that if all the platform efforts were confined to one party and the other party wholly refrained from the use of this method of persuading the electorate the silent party would be placed at an immense disadvantage. This is one reason why in political campaigns both parties make constant use of the platform and put forward their ablest, and most eloquent speakers.

Campaign speaking has the important effect of arousing the interest of many electors who would be otherwise indifferent, and hence of bringing to the polls a large number who would not otherwise record their votes. It is moreover instructive to the general public. The speakers necessarily prepare themselves by a study of financial, commercial, industrial and agricultural affairs, the policies of parties, the records of public men and statistics showing the country's progress. Doubtless facts are too frequently misstated, and misrepresentations made, but these are promptly noted by alert opponents, and the correction made, enforced by proofs, invariably results to the disadvantage and loss of the party in whose behalf the erroneous statements were put forward. In fact an election campaign frequently verifies Solomon's proverb: "He that is first in his own cause seemeth just, but his neighbor cometh and searcheth him."

Senator Dewey, himself a rare orator who has made a close study of campaign methods, has laid down certain rules for political platform speakers from which we extract a few points for the benefit of those engaged on both sides in the present political campaign. Among these rules are that the speaker shall be honest, discreet, well-informed and respectful both of his hearers and himself. He should speak the truth and feel it—"talk as if he knew what he was talking about, and believed every word he said." A speech, he says, should have a solid foundation of facts which cannot be successfully disputed. It should be put in plain English, so that every one may understand it. The argument should be relieved with illustrations, historical or personal, and occasionally pointed with an apt story. There should be no abuse. The weakness of opponents may be ridiculed lightly, but to call names or impute unworthy motives is the height of folly.
