GIRL KEPT IN A ROOM FOR SIX YEARS.

CHATHAM, Ont., Sept. 21.—A case of destitution unparalleled in the annals of Kent county was reported by High Constable Peters and Dr. C. R. Cameron Davis, colored, in Chatham Township, and found there, in a dark and filthy room to which light entered only through cracks in a boarded window, Mary Jane Davis, who for the last six years is said to have been confined in the room. The woman was partially naked and moved about the room on her hands and knees like a wild animal. Her long confinement had apparently bereft her of speech, and she is in a state of complete idiocy. The house in which the father and two sons live is simply a hovel with mud floors. The father told the officers he had \$13,300 in the bank and owned a good farm. The girl will be placed in a good home and it is likely that action will be taken against Davis.

BULGARIANS FAIL IN DOBRUDJA.

(Canadian Press Despatch)
LONDON, Sept. 22.—(New York Times).—The correspondent of the Daily Chronicle at Bucharest sends the following, dated September 18th: "News from both fronts, Transylvania and Dobrudja, the invading Bulgarian have been attempting to dig themselves into cover, but this attempt has been frustrated by concentrated artillery fire from the Allies' guns. Here the enemy has made no fresh infantry assaults on the Russo-Rumanian positions. It would seem that he is disheartened by his recent failures. The allied artillery has silenced a number of the enemy's heavy guns."
