**LI HUNG CHANG'S LETTER.**

A letter has just come to light which was written by the great Li Hung Chang to one of the Chinese Ministers in September, 1902, just before the writer died. The eminent Chinese statesman had long been suspected of being secretly in the pay of Russia, and to this source a considerable portion of his enormous wealth was attributed. The occasion on which the letter was written was just after the suppression of the Boxer rising and when Russia was pressing China to agree to her proposed occupation of Manchuria. The proposed occupation was not opposed by Germany or France but was distasteful to Great Britain and the United States and particularly exasperating to Japan.

In the letter referred to Li Hung Chang set out that China alone could not withstand Russia, and that none of the powers were likely to come to her rescue against Russian aggression. He advised that Russia for the time be allowed to take quiet possession of Manchuria; that this would give rise to friction and probably to war between Russia and Japan over Korea; that when such war should break out China should wait to see which would be victorious and then join the

winner against the defeated. If Russia conquered, helping to crush Japan would earn the gratitude of the former, which would then give up Manchuria for Korea; if Japan was the victor, helping to expel Russia would secure the restoration of the occupied territory.

Li Hung Chang's forecast that the occupation of Manchuria by Russia would bring about a war between that power and Japan has been amply fulfilled. Whether or not the policy of China has been based upon the recommendation of her former chief statesman we have no means of knowing, further than that China has been so far a neutral spectator of the progress of the great struggle. It is possible that China may yet join her forces with Japan and thus entirely fulfill the program plotted two years ago, but such action would be diplomatically resisted by France and Germany. Still the apprehension exists that China may join forces with Japan after the fall of Port Arthur and get back Manchuria as the price of her assistance.

**THE RAILWAY COMMISSION.**

Just before the resignation of Hon. A. G. Blair from the Chairmanship of the Railway Commission the Toronto Globe contained a highly appreciative article on the doings of that important Board. The following instance was cited: The town of Almonte is in the Ottawa valley and on the Canadian Pacific Railway; seven miles north from Carleton Junction. A manufacturing company in Almonte complained to the commission that the Railway was charging too much for hauling coal these seven miles, thus putting Almonte at disadvantage as compared with Carleton Junction.

The Commission enquired into the grievance and promptly ordered the Canadian Pacific to cut down the rate from forty cents to twenty cents. The company was obliged to comply. We have the Globe's testimony that under Mr. Blair's chairmanship no complaint was too insignificant to be promptly inquired into and determined, and that hundreds of such cases were disposed of which never reached the public at all. The Commission has so far been a highly useful body, but to all intents and purposes Mr. Blair was the Commission, without him, and until an equally competent, fearless and honest man occupies in the chairmanship, the Board will be shorn of much of its usefulness.

**SUICIDED WHILE DESPONDENT.**

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—Despondent because he had failed to make a success of his business since coming to this country a few months ago, P. Gardard, French expert in precious stones, today jumped from one of the approaches of the New Williamsburg Bridge and was dashed to death on the stone pavement, 125 feet below. He had lived at the French Boarding House and was out of work and without funds. The proprietor of the boarding house stated that Gardard came of a wealthy French family and had once been an officer in the French army. He was about 40 years old.
