FOURTH WEEK OF REBELLION

HAVANA, Sept. 9.—The fourth week of the rebellion opens with the government's forces better equipped and improved in discipline, but enlistments are slow. President Palma's action in calling a special session of congress is meeting with adverse criticism. Many persons believed that no good purpose will be served by a discussion of the causes of the war and on peace proposals by the congress.

The veterans' peace committee continues hopeful of being able to persuade Pino Guerra to cease activities temporarily and possibly of inducing him to come to Havana and join in the negotiations for peace. The attitude of the leader of the Liberals continues to preclude hopes of an immediate peace.
