THE farming World of Sept. says: The present prices for eggs are not considered very profitable for receivers and there is a tendency to hoist prices too high in the country. P. E. Island eggs sell in Montreal from 12 1/2 to 13c. The general price for candled stock there is 13 to 14c., while small lots sell to the local trade at 16 and 17c. for choice quality. Our exports of eggs this season to date show an increase of 87 per cent. as compared with the same period last year. New-laid eggs are scarce here and bring 13 1/2 to 14c. in large lots. Other quality bring 12 1/2 to 13c.

DR. PATON IN LONDON

His Thrilling Tale of Life's Work.

INCREASED INTEREST

In the Missionary Work Now Being Conducted in the New Hebrides.

Of all the many noble men who have sacrificed the pleasures of civilized life and gone into heathen lands to preach the Gospel of Christ, perhaps Dr. J. G. Paton is the best known. His labors among the savage South Sea Islanders have attracted the attention of the Christian world, and to-day his personality stands out as the most remarkable of the missionary age. Some years ago he came to Canada on a furlough and though here to recruit health and strength, still he found time to tell of his eventful life in the New Hebrides. Those who heard him then have longed for another opportunity of listening to his marvellous story. Consequently the First Presbyterian Church was well filled Sunday morning, King street was crowded in the afternoon, and a large congregation taxed St. Andrew's to its utmost capacity at night, for the venerable doctor had been announced to speak on each of these occasions. Years have not stolen the fire from his eye or the vigor from his limbs. He is still a clear forceful speaker, and a man of almost tireless energy.

As soon as the missionary began to speak at St. Andrew's a hush fell over the edifice and the whole audience hung on every word. When Dr. Paton went to Anaitum forty-two years ago he found that Rev. Drs. Geddes and Inglis had already met with some measure of success there. They had erected two churches and induced many of the savages to wear clothing. Before the doctor left the island for Tanna, one of the churches had been burned and the ministers placed in very perilous positions. In Tanna and Erromanga missionary effort had met with many severe reverses. The first two ministers sent out to the former island were driven from it before they could learn the native language, but nevertheless Dr. Paton won over some of the cannibals and was permitted to labor among them. Many were the times, however, when his life was in imminent danger. The converts on one island were so anxious to have the complete Bible in their own tongue that they grew ardent for thirteen years, and thus raised \$21,200 to pay for the translation and printing of it. Up to the present time portions of the Holy Word have been translated into twenty-two different native languages. In concluding his address the doctor said that the glorious gospel would go on conquering and to conquer until the New Hebrides from shore to shore would sing the praises of Christ.—London News.
