Efforts were being made to protect the arable lands by planting shrubs along the shore. In Denmark lumber districts where sand invasion were required to plant sufficient trees or shrubs to safeguard the land. On the northern shore denudation of the forests and the resulting erosion had choked the harbors with sand bars.

The dealers prices were:—Butter per lb, twenty to twenty-five cents; chickens per lb, ten to eleven cents; eggs per doz, twenty-three to twenty-five cents; fowl per lb, nine to ten cents; hay pressed per ton, nine fifty to ten fifty; hides per lb, eight to nine cents; black oats per bus, forty-two to forty-three cents; white oats per bus, forty-one cents; pork per lb, ten to eleven cents; potatoes per bus, twenty-five to thirty cents and turnips twenty to twenty-five.
