WAR ZONE HISTORY.

(From the Boston Herald.) The "war zone" idea is not new. Great Britain proclaimed a "danger area" in the North Sea early in October, and at about the same time France announced a "danger zone" in the Adriatic. The British and French areas were mined. They were declared in response to the alleged previous laying of mines by their opponents. Such areas are more properly called "danger zones," as is evident from the statements of the Chinese delegates to the second Hague conference in 1907 that 600 Chinese small boats had been sunk by mines, and with considerable loss of life in the area of the Russo-Japanese mine-laying activities. China was then neutral. No protest seems to have gone further than the British contention that "no international usage sanctions the employment by one belligerent of mines or other secret contrivances which would without notice render dangerous the navigation of the high seas."

Since that time it has generally been recognized that a "war zone" or a "strategic area," or a "danger zone" or other similar area, must be within the effective control of the belligerent maintaining it. His mastery must be complete to give him the right to exclude non-combatant vessels or vessels engaged in innocent commerce. Japan recognized this in 1905 when she established "defensive sea areas" and made provision by which an innocent vessel approaching them could choose a route of safety away from or through such waters. The prerequisite now recognized as essential in establishing and maintaining a "war zone" is that it be actually and effectively under the control of the belligerent, and that it be so administered that an innocent vessel shall not incur risk except through its own choice.

The German "war zone" has by proclamation been extended far beyond any limit over which the naval forces have effective and complete control. Innocent commerce has had no optional safe course. This policy therefore finds no sanction in accepted international usage.

FAMOUS GIRL SPY IN THE CIVIL WAR

(From the New York Times)

Stonewall Jackson's valley campaign was one of the great deeds of history. Not since Napoleon's time have men been so dazzled as they were by that great exploit of his. Yet Stonewall might have gone down the valley in defeat had it not been for a little college girl named Belle Boyd.

The Union Gen. Shields was quartered at Miss Boyd's house. He held a council of war there. Miss Boyd bored a hole in the floor of her chamber, which was over Shield's room, and lay there with her ear to it throughout the night. The next morning Stonewall Jackson was in full possession of the plans for a great battle and was able to defeat the Union army.

She kept up her valiant work for the Confederacy until the Union officers began to suspect her, and Jackson ordered her to move from her Shenandoah home to Winchester. She had been arrested by the federals and had firted her way to liberty—for she was a pretty girl, despite the libelous photographs of her. In Winchester Jackson conferred upon her a commission as captain in the Confederate army. By this time the whole North had become aware of the services she was rendering the Confederacy, and every officer and private was on the alert to get her. Yet she escaped until 1864, when she was caught on a blockade runner. Her captor lost his heart to her, deserted the navy, and married her, and the Prince of Wales, afterwards Edward VII, attended the wedding.

Belle Boyd is the most famous of spies, but there are many others who deserve at least as much fame as she won. One of them was Elizabeth B. Van Lew, who had the incredible courage to act as a Union spy in Richmond throughout the war. She did not confine her activities to spying and reporting what she had discovered to the Union generals. She dealt out messages to soldiers in Libby from their homes.

There was one girl who won the rank of major in the Union army. She was Pauline Cushman, an actress, who became one of the best and most famous spies of the Union army. Of

ten Maj. Pauline acted as a sort of advance guard to the federal army. Twice the Confederates captured her, but on both occasions she escaped. The first time she came near being released after a first search, but a second revealed the fact that in a hidden recess in her garments there were orders from Thomas. She was about to be hanged when Thomas captured Nashville and saved her. Secretary Stanton commissioned her as Major Belle Reynolds, the wife of a captain in the 70th Illinois, who went to the war with her husband and performed such prodigies of valor that Stanton honored her with a commission.

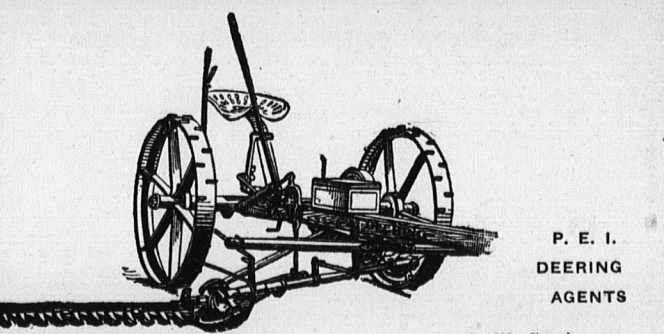
