WRECK OF THE JACQUES CARTIER.

A principal topic of discussion in the City on Saturday was the wreck of the local steamer Jacques Cartier in the gale of Friday night. Fortunately there were no passengers on board, and the crew were all saved after a night of serious peril. As for the steamer, she was getting old, and having been built for river service many were a little distrustful of her sea-worthiness in the open water in time of storm. Still she has been well commanded and manned, and has done good service, carrying freight and passengers east and west from Charlottetown to other ports in Queen's County during the past ten or twelve years without any serious mishap. The end came, not apparently from any want of sea-worthiness but from an accident to which the best sea-going craft are sometimes liable, the rudder being carried away.

We congratulate Captain Walker, his officers and crew on their escape. It is also fortunate that the accident occurs at about the time of closing navigation, which will give time to obtain another steamer for this service before the reopening next spring. The service is one which cannot be dispensed with and yet the traffic is hardly sufficient to maintain a fast or an expensive boat. Still we think it will be conceded that in view of the growth of tourist travel during the summer season and some general increase of business, a somewhat faster craft, which would provide more comfortable accommodation for passengers would, with the usual sub-sidy perhaps yield a better return than the Cartier. It is understood that the wrecked steamer was never very profitable to her owners, some twenty in number, mostly located in this city.

BRITISH OPINION

It is quite true that in the discussion of the Canadian trade preference with the Colonial Conference, Mr. Chamberlain contended that the preference had not accomplished all that had been hoped to result from it, and a good deal has been made of this fact by those Canadian journals that are opposed to the preference. But it is also true, and the fact ought not to be lost sight of that Mr. Chamberlain admitted that our tariff preference had accomplished something. What he did say on the subject may be fairly epitomised as follows: That the National Policy struck a severe blow at British trade with Canada, and that the liberal tariff of 1897 has helped to restore British trade to its old position. The modest admission is at least worth something.

It would be easy to quote opinions from many exporters and manufacturers of British goods to show that they have a hearty appreciation of the preferential tariff. Many of them acted upon it by sending their travellers and agents to Canada after the preference came into operation, who had not done so before. Many of them referred to the preference in favorable terms in the advertisements which they sent to the Canadian trade journals. The advertisements of British wholesalers, manufacturers and exporters which

appeared in Canadian newspapers were doubled, in number. And where our imports from Britain were falling off from year to year the decline, was checked and an increase of trade took its place. These are indisputable facts.

And more than one leading British newspaper has had good words to say for the preferential tariff. Quite recently the London Standard made the following statement: "The policy adopted by the Canadian Government and still adhered to by Sir Wilfrid Laurier, has been accompanied by and has visibly helped to produce, a notable increase of Canadian trade with the Mother Country as well as with other states." It would be a great mistake to assume that British opinion depreciates or undervalues the preferential tariff, or would view its repeal with complacency. On the contrary there is every reason to believe that the repeal of the preference, if it should be attempted here, after would be met on the other side with a storm of disapproval.

We print in another page of this issue by request a portion of a strong and eloquent temperance address delivered on 12th October last by Rev. Patrick Murphy in the Paulist Fathers Church, New York. The occasion was the memorial service in honor of Father Mathew, the Irish Apostle of temperance. Probably no other man accomplished so much in his time for the cause of sobriety as did Father Mathew. At first he labored in the cause for nearly a year with little result, but before he ended his work nearly one half the adult population of Ireland had joined him and the official records show that the duties on Irish spirits fell from £1,434,573 in 1830 to \$862,418 in 1844. Father Murphy in New York is a giant in the cause of temperance reform, and there are many other Roman Catholic clergymen throughout the world and in our own Island whose work in promoting temperance is worthy of the highest commendation.
