CATHOLIC CHURCH SUPPORTS BRITAIN

MONTREAL, Aug. 21.—A plain invitation was given yesterday evening by the Rev. Father Brophy that the hierarchy of the Catholic Church in the Province of Quebec had endorsed the part taken by Canada in the present war, so that if any persons wished to campaign against that participation, they must announce their separation from the Catholic Church. This reference to the Nationalist campaign was only one of many cogent remarks made by Father Brophy in the course of a powerful recruiting address made at the meeting of the Irish Rangers at the Dominion Square recruiting station yesterday evening.

There was one of the largest audiences yet had for an ordinary meeting nearly three thousand persons surrounding the platform, while the oratory was made the more notable in that the two main speakers were Father Brophy and Major Smyth, the Protestant chaplain of the Rangers, who voluntarily attended the meeting and heartily agreed with all that had been said by Father Brophy.

"Canadians have already won undying glory for our land in this great war," said Father Brophy. "We are doing all we can, and waiting bravely and manfully the end of the war. We know it can only end when we win, and that it can only be won by men and munitions. We must have the rifles, bayonets, cannon and other arms—but none of these will be any use unless we have men, and brave men, too, behind them."

There was just one way to beat the enemy, said Father Brophy, and that was to fight him. It was nonsense to talk of starving out the Central Powers; they were too rich and too well organized. Further, Father Brophy declared that it was just as foolish to make any talk about this being a war of the Kaiser and the military junta.


"That is not the case," said he. "This is a war of the German people, and behind it is every man, woman and child in Germany, ready to back up and fight for their century-old idea of establishing a military domination of the world. 'Nothing was ever sacred to a German,'" he exclaimed. "Treaties were always mere scraps of paper to them, since the time of Clovis. It is the German people who are at war, and they are the people who supplied the spies in our midst, the German hyperphatics, and all the rest. We cannot win this war until we have beaten the German people."

In vigorous terms Father Brophy showed that the first line of Canada's defence lay with the Allies in Flanders, and France, and that if once Great Britain were beaten Canada would be easy prey. "Then," he asked, "how would you like to have a Von Bissing, for a governor, and everyone of you be forced into the army under German officers?"

United States Helpless.

"Some say we could turn to the United States for protection," said Father Brophy. "Why, they cannot even protect their own people on the high seas. When their citizens were foully assassinated by German undersea reptiles, the United States could not avenge them. The most humiliating thing I have read of in all this war was the appearance in Baltimore harbor of a German submarine, a sister ship to the murderer of the Lusitania, and the United States could not lift a finger. 'Think you it was to bring over a cargo of dyes or take back a few tons of copper that this submarine came?' No. It was Germany's warning to the United States. 'The answer is plain. The United States could not help us. We fall or we stand with England, and we are going to stand.' (Cheers.)"

"We are fighting with the Empire, concluded Father Brophy, and we must have some say in the terms of peace. But just now we are not fighting for peace. We are fighting for victory. We do not want to patch up any peace treaty; we want to throttle the villain, just as we would deal with any other murderer. We must put Germany back where she belongs, as a group of principalities. She must have no army, only policemen, and no navy."

(Applause)

In concluding Fr. Brophy said that the war must be fought to a determined conclusion, and such an example made of Germany that never again could she dare to attempt to saddle her immoral ambitions upon the world.

A brief speech was made by Major Smyth, who strongly supported the arguments of Father Brophy, especially those with reference to the support of the Canadian participation in the war by the Catholic hierarchy.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made in any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in accordance with the provisions of the Act. A homesteader may live on his land for a period of six months in each of three years. Must reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
