—GREEN'S BROOK APPROVED—Mr. Doane of Halifax, N. S., who has been in Summerside making a survey to increase the local water supply, sent in his report to the Water and Sewerage Commissioners on Tuesday. Of several sites surveyed by him, he advised that the spring at Green's Brook would be the most suitable for additional water supply. It has been found necessary to increase the water supply as although there is sufficient for ordinary use, in the case of a big fire the supply would be inadequate, and the fire underwriters had threatened to raise the rate if the supply was not increased. The supply is as good as it has ever been but the consumption has been increasing at a rate of 5 per cent for some years. Mr. Doane also advised that the stand pipe be securely anchored, as at present it sways when there is a heavy wind, which is very unsafe. This matter should be looked into immediately.—S.

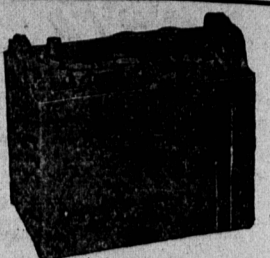
—NATIVE OF ST. ELEANORS—Many friends in St. Eleanors and Summerside are pleased to learn of the appointment of Rev. A. E. Andrew, M. A., M. C., as Canon of All Saints Cathedral, Halifax, at the recent Diocesan meetings held in Halifax last week. Canon Andrew was born in St. Eleanors on Sept. 12th, 1872 and was educated at Summerside High School and King's College Windsor, N. S. He has had a distinguished career. He obtained his B. A., in 1894 and his M. A., in 1920. He was made a deacon in 1895 and priest in 1896. He was curate at St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, 1895-1896, curate at Glace Bay N. S., 1896 to 1899. Had charge of Antigonish Parish from 1899 to 1908. In 1908 he went to Pictou, his present parish, but left there in 1916 for overseas service and was with chaplain services C. E. F., from 1917 to 1919. He was chaplain of the Royal Canadian Regiment in France and was awarded the Military Cross "for conspicuous gallantry during the operations near Cambrai, from Sep. 27th to Oct. 1st 1918." (London Gazette, No 31219, dated 8, 3, 19). After five years he became rector of Newport, N. S., from 1924-1925 and from 1925 to 1926 was rector of North Sidney. He returned to St. James Church at Pictou in 1926 and has remained there until now. Rev. Mr. An-

### Apply Dehydration For Nova Scotia

(Canadian Press) HALIFAX, May 10.—A new process for the dehydration of apples will be put in operation at a plant to be set up at some point in the Annapolis Valley, Hon. D. P. Gocher, Nova Scotia Minister of Agriculture, has announced.

Federal and provincial departments are contributing to the cost of establishing the plant, but T. S. Simms and Company, of Saint John, who develops the process, will be responsible for providing the working capital, management and operation.

Nova Scotia dehydrated apples should capture the top market of the world, now held by the California product, the Minister said tonight. He had studied the new process carefully and examined and sampled the finished product, and was convinced the process should prove of great value.
