U.S. Air Force Bases in Canada

OTTAWA, March 2. — (CP) — Prime Minister Mackenzie King said today in the House of Commons that no detachment of the United States Air Force is stationed in Canada on the South Shore of the St. Lawrence River, but that from time to time United States aircraft and personnel operate at various points in Canada with Dominion consent.

He was answering J. S. Roy (Ind. Gaspe) who asked whether an American air force unit had been mentioned in the House of Commons on the South Shore of the St. Lawrence River.

Mr. King said it was impossible to answer such questions in detail for security reasons.

In connection with defence operations land had been acquired on occasion by the Canadian Government which had been developed for airfield purposes and used by the United States. By an agreement already announced, such facilities would return to Canada after the war.

ARIATIONS ON XMAS TWIST

When dough has been punched down ("see above") form into two long rolls about 1 inch in diameter.
