Contract Bridge

REGARDING PENALTY DOUBLES
In the opinion of many fine players, the true criterion of a penalty double is not so much whether the contract can actually be defeated, but whether the opponents will have the material and the fortitude to redouble. In other words, it does not make a vast amount of difference at rubber bridge if a doubled contract is fulfilled without overtricks, but successful redoubles can account for huge scores. Let's look at a typical case:

South dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

♠ A K 5 2	♥ A K 8 4	♦ 8 5 3	♣ Q J 7

The bidding:
South West North East
1 Pass Pass 1♣ Pass
2♥ Pass 2♦ (5) Pass
3♥ Pass Pass 3♦ Pass
Redbl. Pass Pass Pass

Allusion was made to a "typical" case, but it must be admitted that North's rebid of his four-card heart suit was more remarkable than typical. Obviously, North should have raised at this point to three no-trump.
North's actual bidding however turned out very lucky, in that it seems to have given East the impression that North did not like a no-trump contract. Not that this excuses East's double — the bidding by both North and South was far too strong for East to risk such a dangerous action. He could not expect his partner to produce a single trick, and he himself could not possibly guarantee the defeat of a nine-trick contract.
The redouble was eminently satisfactory when West opened a low club. East's ace were quickly removed, and declarer could then run eleven tricks with the greatest of ease.
A spade lead by West — strongly indicated by East's double — would have saved the 800 points in overtricks, but East's double still would have made him look very bad.
