'The latest news first of all.' The mail train arrived in Charlottetown at ten fifteen last evening. The warmest temperature registered yesterday was fifty three degrees. Percy Turner, who spent the week end in this City, returned to his home in O'Leary yesterday. Duncan Marshall, formerly of this Province, spoke in the Opera House at Innesfall, Alberta, recently. Miss Georgie Boyd, Moncton, who has been the guest of Miss Pearl Hunter returned home yesterday.

The enterprise Foundry Company of Backville, manufacturers of high grade stoves, ranges and furnaces, who were burned out some weeks ago, have written a friend in this City that they are pushing forward the erection of their new buildings, machinery and patterns on the same site as formerly. When they get on the market again in a short time they will have one of the most up-to-date establishments of the kind in Canada.

Islander, who almost reached the century mark—the late William Townsend, who died on July 3rd last, at the residence of his son, William A. Townsend, of Bay Fortune, near Hula Bay. He had reached the age of 94 years. He was the father, also, of Richard Townsend, who has made his home in Oakland for many years. For thirty-one years he has been a trusted employee of the Southern Pacific Railway. Another son, George, and one daughter, Mrs. Robert Gallagher, reside in Boston. It was Robert Gallagher who had the \$60,000 contract for plastering and ornamenting the Christian Science Church, Boston, a few years ago. The late William Townsend was a brother-in-law of the Hon. James and Hon. W. W. Lord, names that will be cherished on the Island by future generations.

A wedding of more than usual interest took place in the Tremont Methodist Episcopal Church, Boston, on last Thursday evening. The principals in the happy event were Miss Margaret Bernice McLeod, only daughter of the late Dr. James McLeod, of Charlottetown, P. E. Island, and Frank T. Thomas, of the firm of O. H. Thomas, and Co., Fredericton, N. B. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Henry Whitton, D. D. The bride was attended and was given away by her mother. Special music was furnished by the choir of the church. The bride looked charming in a traveling suit of gun-metal broadcloth and carried a beautiful bouquet of roses and maiden hair fern. Among the guests present were a large number of relatives and friends from Charlottetown. Immediately after the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Thomas left on an extended wedding tour of Canada, and will reside in Fredericton.
