THE PEOPLE HAVE GONE RUBBER MAD

LONDON, April 21—Rubber has risen to the record figure of 12s. 10d. per pound. Two years ago the price was 2s. 9d. a pound.

There are now in existence nearly 100 rubber plantation companies, most of them of recent origin, and the number increases daily. The rubber market is now believed to have reached its climax. Yesterday eight new companies asked for subscriptions, the total capital asked being \$1,775,000. The banks taking in subscriptions were rushed by mobs of men, women and even children. Brokers, clerks, commissionaries, messenger boys and street porters fought their way to the counters to throw in the applications for shares. In a few minutes the two chief companies were over-subscribed, and a little later in the day there were dealings in these lottery tickets at 500 and 600 per cent. premium. Two-shilling shares were run after at 14s. and 15s., while for one pound shares as much as seven pounds were cheerfully paid, or rather promised, for all these transactions are done by special settlement, in other words, on long credit. No money may have to be put up for several months, and in the interval prices are expected to double or treble themselves.

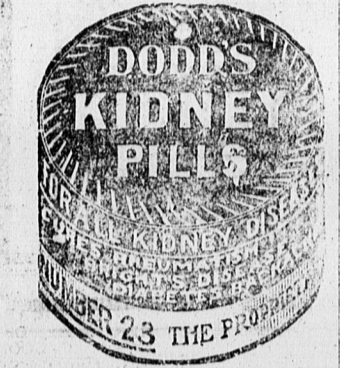
