MASSACHUSETTS CONVENTION

Resulted in Split Ticket - For Democrat Whitney and Bartlett the Nominees - Republicans United in Governor Guild.

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., Oct. 6. (Special) - The Democratic Convention on Saturday resulted in a split - two separate tickets being nominated, one headed by Henry M. Whitney, and the other by Gen. C. W. Bartlett.

Whitney's platform was tariff revision and reciprocity. The Republicans unanimously renominated Governor Guild.

RUSSIAN SCHOOL CHILDREN SUICIDE

One Hundred and Fourteen Took Their Own Lives in 1906.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 5 - During 1906 there were 180 attempts to commit suicide among the pupils of the Russian high schools. Of this number 114 succeeded in taking their lives. The disturbed state of country is given as being the main reason for this state of affairs.

BEGGING FROM COUNT TOLSTOI

Asks Requests For Aid Be Discontinued as He Has No Property.

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 5 - A letter was published here to-day from Count Tolstoi, asking that the stream of requests for financial assistance addressed to him be discontinued, and explaining that twenty years ago he surrendered his property to his heirs as if already dead and that the sole sums at his disposal are occasional foreign contributions which he distributes in the neighborhood.

BARKENTIVE HAS LONG OCEAN TRIP.

The Elise's Terrible Voyage 47 Days From Liverpool to Sydney.

NORTH SYDNEY, October 5 - The barkentine Elise, salt laden, from Liverpool, has arrived here after the toughest experience in Captain Johannessen's career. The barkentine left Liverpool forty-seven days ago and for three consecutive days and night the commander stood at the wheel without sleep. Off Scatter he signalled the Bona Vista for bearings and within thirty minutes reached port.

THE PRINCE COUNTY EXHIBITION ENDS

A Fine Day on Saturday Brought Larger Attendance Than on the Day Before - The Exhibition A Success - Result of The Races.

The Prince County Exhibition opened on Saturday with better prospects than on the preceding day. The heavy rain on Friday night had driven the farmers from the harvest fields who otherwise would have been too busy to attend. The morning trains from east and west brought a greater number into Summerside and the attendance numbered about 2000. Judging by the number of exhibits and the enthusiasm of the competitors the Prince County Exhibition bids fair to be a greater success than ever next year. The races were started at three in the afternoon with a heavy track from the previous night's rain. Five horses started in the 2.30 class Mamie P at the pole. The races were well contested and considerable excitement ruled during the afternoon. Mamie P won in three straight heats but was well pushed by Helen who took

the second place, also in three straight heats, Lady Parkwood third; Parkerlando fourth; and Parker S fourth. Time 2.27 1/2. SOUNDS KNELL OF HOUSE OF LORDS

Sir Henry Campbell, The British Premier Says Reform of The House of Lords Will Be The Issue of His Party

EDINBURG, Oct 6 (Special) - Sir Henry Campbell Bannerman in a speech here on Saturday returned to the attack on the House of Lords, of whom he predicted

they would be in sackcloth and ashes before another session passed. He predicted that a reform of the Lords would be the issue on which he would appeal to the people.

IRON ORE AREAS AT ST. GEORGE

American Capitalists Said to be Interesting Themselves in Extensive Deposit.

SYDNEY, October 5 - A number of American capitalists and mineral experts are at present interesting themselves in an iron ore proposition at St. George, on the west coast of Newfoundland, which in the near future may develop useful possibilities for the future owners. This iron ore mine, or rather mountain, is property of C. W. Bishop, a native of St. George, and according to a gentleman who has lately returned from the mining colony, where he has been examining the areas, there is wealth of mineral deposited at that point, assays of ore, which is of a black magnetic variety and has shown as high as from 60 to 65 per cent. metallic iron. The mountain of ore runs sheer to the water's edge and rises to a height of 300 feet in practically a solid mass of mineral.

SMILED AT IDEA OF YELLOW PERIL

Rev. C. K. Harrington in Sydney After 21 Years in Mission Fields.

SYDNEY, October 5 - Rev. Charles Kendall Harrington has returned to his old home in Sydney after having spent twenty one years in the mission fields of the Far East. Mr. Harrington smiled at the suggestion of the yellow peril.

The development of the Northwest, indeed of the whole of America, has only been arrested, he said, by the scarcity of labor. It is almost imperative that you employ Asiatics. Either that or you leave undeveloped great stretches, entailing loss well nigh impossible to estimate. And why not Asiatic labor? The Japanese, at all events, might well be employed with impunity. Their ability is well known. They are industrious, they never get drunk and they don't talk back. Indeed, they are far from being undesirable acquisitions to a country.

SIR WILFRED TO SPEAK IN LOWELL

The Federation of French Societies Want to Hear Him Talk.

BOSTON, Oct. 5. The Federation of French Societies in Lowell are endeavoring to induce Sir Wilfrid Laurier to visit Lowell this fall. Several other New England cities made similar attempts last year, but the premier was too busy at that time to visit this part of the country.

NEW LINERS FOR THE C. P. R.

Directors to Arrange for Construction of Fast Boats For Atlantic Service.

MONTREAL, Oct. 5 - At an annual meeting of the shareholders of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company the board of Directors was authorized to arrange for the construction or acquisition of two additional steamships for the Pacific trade or to build two larger and faster boats for the Atlantic service, transferring the Empress of Britain and Empress of Ireland to the Pacific, and to incur the necessary capital expenditure therefor.

BOY KILLED BY TRACTION ENGINE

Sad death of Son of Leader of the Alberta Opposition.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 6 - (Special) - Perry Robertson, the three year old son of A J Robertson, Leader of the Opposition in the Alberta Legislature was fatally injured yesterday. He was run over by a wagon which was being drawn through the town by a traction engine, and died a few hours after the accident.

HALF MILLION P.O. FOR MONTREAL

Canada Appoints Arthur Gefferon, Immigration Commissioner, to France.

MONTREAL, Oct. 5 - The Department of Public Works have just awarded to P L Yall and Sons, of this City, the contract for the erection of the new Montreal Post Office on the site which was purchased from the Gazette Printing Co., and which will be handed over to the Department in a few days. The contract price is in the vicinity of half a million dollars.

The Interior Department have appointed Arthur Gefferon advocate and ex-president of the club National, Immigration Commissioner to France, and the statement is made that a very active propaganda will be carried out in that country on the same lines as in the British Isles.
