"CITIZEN" of Georgetown in yesterday's issue of this paper complained of undue alarm being caused about small-pox in that town. Summerside can sympathize with our easterly friends because of having had a similar experience about one year ago when a few light cases were found in the country several miles from Cape Tormentine and when there was really not as much danger as recently in Georgetown. Summerside will sympathize with "Citizen" also when he makes such an erroneous statement as to say that Georgetown will remain during the coming winter the only entrance to P. E. I. from the outside world. Has he not yet heard of the Summer-side-Tormentine route or does he wish to cover up the facts that the steamer Stanley will operate on this the shortest route between this Province and the Mainland?

It is strange, surpassing strange, how many people will take upon themselves the credit of events both small and great. The first man to propose or suggest the Summerside-Tormentine route as the best means of communication between this province and the outside world may or may not be alive to-day, we are not sure. The first newspaper to take hold of the matter and push it, may or may not have had some weight with the "powers," it is difficult to say. The first representative of the Commons to advance the project, may or may not have been a hero in its behalf,—it is questionable. Perhaps the present representative at Ottawa may have had something to do with it—perhaps they had not. The first government to hear and consider the scheme may not be in power when the route is established, and the honors may not be due them. The Summerside Board of Trade who so ably supported the move were practically instrumental in the ultimate success of getting a guarantee of having the route properly tested,—but the assistance previously rendered from various sources may have had a powerful influence in the matter. One man can sometimes accomplish a good deal; one newspaper has a certain amount of prestige; one government—and one Board of Trade—oftentimes has great power. But we are inclined to believe that it took many, many men, many newspapers and many governments to bring the Stanley to Summerside. And who will say that Nature has not lent a helping hand?
