TRAIN SERVICE EAST.

The Guardian has already spoken of the winter train service on the eastern section of the Island Railway. The people last year asked for a double train service during the winter months between Charlottetown and Souris and Georgetown, believing that they are entitled to the accommodation, which would also be a great convenience to the travelling public and would develop increased traffic in the future. Of course it is for those more principally concerned to make their wishes known in the proper quarter as soon as may be, for the winter time table must be prepared and go into effect at a not distant date. King's County has an influential supporter of the Government in Mr. Hughes, M. P., and under the circumstances may fairly expect that a reasonable request would be conceded.

The broad eastern section of the Province has undoubted claims in this matter which ought to command attention. There has been much disappointment that the Murray Harbor Railway is not opened to traffic as was expected. Again it is to be observed that Georgetown is the winter port of the Island for several months of the winter, which of itself always gives a large additional passenger, mail and

freight traffic during that period over the eastern portion of the railway. These facts demonstrate the reasonableness of the request for a better train service in the winter than has been enjoyed in past winters. Furthermore, while the western section of the Province enjoys the advantage of two trains daily each way through the winter season it will be difficult to deny equal accommodation to the East, which happens to be the only section which returned a supporter of the Government at the federal election. We hope also when the spring comes round again to see a double train service on the Cape Traverse Branch, where the just claims of the people to additional accommodation have been strongly urged in the past.

Yesterday was a fine winter day without wind or storm but no mails reached the Island from the Mainland.

It is reported that should the special votes place Premier Peters in a minority a seat will be at once offered him in a strong Liberal district in Prince County where his election would be assured.

Declaration Day for the provincial election falls on Wednesday the 21st and thereafter we shall know officially what effect the special votes may have on the returns. Particular interest is felt in the division of special votes in the St. Peters and Fort Augustus districts in which Hon. Messrs Peters and Cumiskey were respectively the Liberal candidates.

We regret that the Examiner people should feel sore over their meagre revenue from advertising, but as they themselves say, "that's their business." WHERE MURDER IS RAMPANT.

A recent article in McClure's Magazine pointed out the alarming increase of crime and violence in the United States. According to this high authority matters have been going from bad to worse. In the United States last year, with a population of about 80,000,000 there were 4,970 murders. In 1891 there were 51,300,000 inhabitants and but 1,200 crimes of this class. In 1841 there was one murder for each 40,000 of population, while in 1903 there was one murder for each 8,900 of population. Murder had increased to seven fold in the aggregate and four and a half times in proportion to population since 1841!

There is far less crime in European than in American cities. London with a population of 6,500,000 had only 24 murders last year. Every one of the murderers was captured by the police; nine were sentenced to be hanged. Four committed suicide and the rest were sent to prison. During the same time in Chicago, with one-fifth the population, according to the Chicago News there were 128 murders. In 18 of these cases the murderers were killed at the time of the crime and four were shot by officers in making the arrests, leaving 106 cases to be dealt with by the police. Out of these only 30 convictions were had, in 19 cases no arrests were made and in 53 cases arrests did not result in conviction.

It has been common to charge this violence and crime to the foreign population, but Mr. McClure points out that in no European state except Russia is homicide so common as in the United States, while in some states in which native American blood is purest crimes of violence are notoriously frequent. The Cleveland Plaindealer goes farther and boldly asserts that "Native Americans are pre-eminent among the man-killers of the world." This is an awful indictment. And it is not framed in an outside or hostile country. It is drawn by American writers of note and repute and published to be read by the American people.
