ROYAL-UNION BANK MERGER

The merger between the Royal Bank of Canada and the Union Bank of Halifax went into effect on Saturday. The Union ceased to do business in this city and elsewhere; but all cheques of the Union Bank that they be affixed will be paid at the Royal; and the Royal will also be pleased to transact all the business heretofore transacted by the Union.
In a circular to the customers of the Union E. Thorne the retiring general manager says: "We appreciate most highly the business you have transacted with us and we earnestly ask that this may be continued with the Royal Bank of Canada, which will then be the third largest Bank in Canada. We are assured that they will, as far as possible, continue the policy of this Bank and that you may expect the same treatment as formerly." Mr Thorne, it may be added, will be Supervisor of the branches of the Royal throughout the Maritime Provinces.
A matter of regret to the citizens of Charlottetown will be the departure, which the merger necessitates of J. W. Ryan, the esteemed and popular, as well as efficient local manager of the Union. Mr Ryan will go to North Sydney and take the local management of the Royal in that town. He has disposed of his fine suburban property Sidmouth, with all its appurtenances, to J. J. McKinnon of Brighton.
The branch of the Royal Bank in this City will remain under the management of A. W. Hyndman. It is needless to say that this arrangement will be pleasing to the Bank's customers and gratifying to Mr Hyndman's personal friends in this native city and province. The Bank of course expects an accession of business which Mr Hyndman is quite competent to deal with. The staff of the Union are being added to the Royal and while some will remain here others will be transferred.

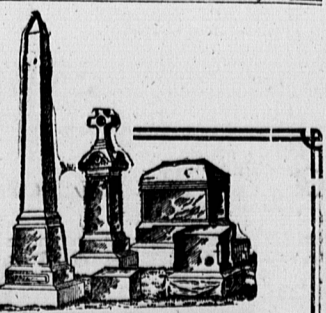
