BATTLESHIP'S LONG VOYAGE

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., July 9.—Fifteen battleships of the Atlantic fleet sailed to-day on the voyage that is to take them around the world and end at Hampton Roads, whence they started last December. The sixteenth member of the fleet, the Nebraska, was left behind because of an outbreak of scarlet fever among the crew. She will be placed in quarantine three days and thoroughly fumigated, after which she will join her sister ships at Honolulu.
Without ceremony or celebration of any sort the fifteen big fighting ships got under way promptly at two o'clock on signal from the Connecticut, Rear Admiral Sperry's flagship, and steaming in single column, slowly wended their way out of the bay, where they had sought anchorage for time to time since their arrival here, two months ago.
The vessels presented a beautiful appearance as they steamed through the harbor. As the Connecticut passed forth the flagship signalled for more speed, and the bows of the warships were soon throwing up a sea of white foam as they plowed through the water. It was 3:10 o'clock when the Kentucky, the last ship in line, passed the lighthouse at the entrance to the Golden Gate and a half an hour the fleet was lost to view in a dense cloud of black smoke from the copes of funnels and the thick weather which was rolling in from the sea.

BRUTAL MURDER IN MONTREAL

MONTREAL, July 9.—Montreal's Chinatown was the scene of a cold-blooded murder early this afternoon when an unknown man was shot dead by a man with whom he had a row last night.
Tong Kee, keeper of a barber shop and opium den at 111 LaGauchetier street west, stated that three men visited his place last night and asked for opium. This was refused them and a little later Kee heard them fighting.
One man was stabbed in the hand and head and left vowing that he would have revenge. This afternoon two of the men again visited Tong Kee's and were followed later by the man who had been stabbed.
He had one arm in a sling and his head bandaged. Entering the room where the two were seated he fired, killing his former comrade instantly. The other man fled and the murderer also escaped. All were well dressed and appeared to have plenty of money.

THE GREYNA GREEN OF THE DOMINION

WINDSOR, Ont., July 9.—Returns for the half year ended June 30, made public today by the city clerk, show a new high water mark for weddings in this city, whose fame as a Greyna Green continues to spread. EXTRAORDINARY FLYING MACHINES

PARIS, July 9.—One of the most extraordinary flying machines ever seen, even in France, has just completed a successful trial on the army manoeuvre grounds at Issy. This is the Malecot "Aeronef," a peculiar mixture of balloon and aeroplane.
The main part of the machine from which the apparatus is controlled is a canvas plane mounted on a bamboo frame, triangular in form, and sixty feet long, with a base of twelve feet. In the centre of the plane is the car, containing the motor and other mechanism. The car also provides a place for a crew of three. The motor drives a ten-foot propeller at a speed of 1,200 revolutions a minute. The plane is placed close below a cigar-shaped balloon one hundred feet long, with a diameter of thirty-two feet.
This week's experiments showed that the "Aeronef" could easily sail away with a dead weight of almost half a ton, rising and descending at the will and with little sacrifice of ballast.
M. Malecot is now completing plans for an aerial omnibus. He is confident that all the heavier aerial vehicles of the future will be modeled on the plan of his machine.

GOT 14 YEARS FOR INHUMAN CRUELTY

GALT, July 9.—John Bunyan, charged with inhuman maltreatment of two horses in a local hotel stable two weeks ago, as a result of which both animals died, was tried before Judge Blake. The evidence, though circumstantial, was complete, and the judge convicted the prisoner, sentencing him to the full penalty provided by the statute—fourteen years in penitentiary. As to the plea of insanity set up, his honor said the man's mental condition could be determined later on.
