TANGO IS INNOCENT, TAME AND MODEST

LONDON, Jan. 10.—The Tango was tried for immodesty yesterday afternoon by a select audience in the Queen's Theatre, to which members of the clergy and society were invited, and acquitted by the overwhelming vote of 751 to 21.

The poll was taken after a performance on the stage where the Argentine tango, and ballroom tango, the Brazilian maxixe, the waltz, and the rag were danced. Among those who were invited were the Duchess of Norfolk, the Countess of Dundonald, the Countess of Ventry, Lady Castlereagh, Lady Templeton, Lady Holmes, Lady Beatrix Wilkinson, Lady Layland-Barratt, Lady Ninian Crichton-Stuart, Lady De Ramsey, Lady Florence Latta and Lady Claverhose-Graham.

The Bishops of Kensington and other members of the clergy who had touched on the tango in Sunday sermons, also were asked to view the shocking or delightful dance at close range. The theatre was full. In several cases society women sent their secretaries to judge and make report, and one man said his wife had permitted him to attend only on the express condition that he would cast two votes against the dance. No member of the clergy wished to be represented officially, but many were there incognito.

The test, so far as the dancing was concerned, was very fair, as the tango was given with all its full swing and startling features and there was no attempt to moderate or "white-wash" it. At first there was some few expressions of "shocking" and "hardly proper" heard, but after the waltz with its modern features were exhibited opinion seemed to be that one
